cattle Extra there is a small Grass bird stops
around the Barn and stacks all this Winter all the
cattle Poultry Horse and all hearty
Wild Ducks some the Fox around cant

1st of January New Years Day 1883
Feeding the sleigh chopped some stove wood
2nd Went to the Bush Broke the off corner of
my axe cut down an old Dead Birch cold Fine

high Wind broke up what ice that was
made 4th Ice taken North Wind cold

High E Wind Freezing very hard cold put a crank on the
Grindstone Feeding the cattle a little Extra the air holes
at the Door is Breaking upwards with the high E W

snowed a little Randolph to the Upper Point to
see how the ice was taken Good Fire cattle
hearty and smart took my sail of the mast as
I think I will have no use for it any more this
Winter the ice must be good enough to cross
a foot 7th Sunday Kind of Mild snowed some
8th High Wind Birth Day 1866 crossed the ice
for the first put out some Brushes Randolph
and I a great many air holes our Road is crooked
with going around those air holes and cracks snowed
some John Hamilton gave me a Ride up with

5 lb of Pepper 15 5th Reading Papers E Wind
Frosty 10th Frosty seen a Cutter crossing
Summers Road cutting wood 11th in the
Bush Leander and I Kind of Fine but Frosty
Randolph putting out manure 12th Went
to Summers town seen Mr Wells a he
treated me seen I go Pare Bone Bought of
John Summers 5 lb Tea 25 7/4 lb 11
Pare 3 cents all this I paid gave him 3 Dollars
to my account I owe him now
3 74 cents John Hamilton to Cornwall
seen the Track of a Mink crossing the ice
to Hamiltons Island 13th Cutting Wood in the

 home but the other sheep and I was
 sure she took the river and was lost
 as when we was looking for her we
 could not find her track we gave
 her up for lost till she came home herself

 Road on the ice to Lancaster coming from
 the South side a Fox crooped from Christs
 Island to our Island Fine and Frosty to
 night 16th Bushing the Road at the Kit Kit
 across from the South side Randolph went to

 Jo Seaway 1 lb 25 and 1 lb 40 of Tea 3 Bagg of
 Soap 15 that on Credit 80 cents I owe him
 Seen 2 of the Bosells Fishing below Storger Island
 a very fine Day The Cow Caley and the Bull
 Bruno had a Wicked Fight to Day for
 a Quet Cow she is awful Savage she
 wont give in although the Bull
 put her down different times 17th in the
 Bush Turned stormy & Wind Blowing
 and snowing Blistering The Bull and cow
 another fight to Day kept her in all Day yet
 W Wind Drifting some Fine Bruno Caley
 another fight but I kept them apart
 as she chases him all over 18th
 Cutting Willows and alders Cold Frosty
