- 11 - Womens Institute Meeting held here in the afternoon
- 12 - Stotts came to thresh 1/2 day 158 Bata + 148^{bu} of wheat
Helped Johnsons to thresh in the afternoon
- 14 - Went to the Glen to church and called on Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Peterson who were camping up there a fine rain last night
- 15 - Helped R. Aitken to thresh. Went to Dentons in afternoon
- 17 - Finished plowing back ten acre field for wheat.
- 19 - Picked Green gage plums, a heavy crop.
- 23 - Finished plow 3 acre field of sod for wheat. (Started to field corn to chow.)
- 24 - Went to Farmers Picnic at Lucke flats a fine day and a great crowd about 30,000 people there.
- 25 - Mayme and children came up for a few days from Brantford
- 25 - Started to plow & young cattle back to the bush.
- 26 - Started to plow clover sod in centre east field very dry
- 25 - Went with W. McPherson & J. Aitken to judge school childrens plots
- 29 - A heavy but very fine rain (over 1/2 in) which was badly needed.
- 30 - Leonis Birthday, her mother giving a Cradle Roll Picnic.
Grandpa & Grandpa Lee, Aunt Lillanette & family coming over
Went to Young Peoples Meeting at Mrs. Collins in the evening.
- 31 - Andrews Birthday a very fine day
- Sept 1st. Mayme and 5 children & Ethel, Lene, Andrew & I went to Woodstock
calling on Nelson Franklins in the afternoon, went to Ingersoll in the
evening staying all night at Breens and going to St. Marys
