1 Plowed the head ridge & sowed it that makes 4 1/2 bushel of Peas the ground is in good order sowed 12 lbs of timothy & 4 lbs of clover seed on that piece fine rain
- a little rain
this forenoon

2 sowed 24 lbs of timothy & 8 lbs of clover seeds on the north end of the middle field that side & gave it one stroke of drag likewise sowed 4 lbs of clover on the east side it was sowed with timothy in the spring on the crest
- 3 rolled the peaground it is in good order for rolling plowed the 2 short ridges in the garden & Ellen planted them with 1/2 bushel of the Early Rose & chillies the ground in good order
- 4 fine rain this morning the trees look green drew dung into the garden
- 5 no meeting to day
- 6 began to plow in the church field & draw stones of it in the mornings & evenings so as to get ^{6 lbs of me} ^{to get} ^{the} ^{stones}
- 7 plowed & drew stones night & morning
- 8 do do do do

- 10 finished the plowing in it all but 5 1/2 ridges for potatoes & sowed 8 bushel of peas & oats
- rain

11 cleaned out the furrows & shoveled the cross furrow & sowed 1 1/2 bushel of oats in the most field where I plowed last fall & sowed it well to pasture it this summer again being a great deal of good
thunder & lightning & rain this evening down
- 12 the Revd Mr Weir preached at Fairfax this morning I took him up here in the evening
- 13 plowed & spread the dung in the garden
- 14 went to Gonanogue with 10 bushel of wheat bought 50th of oatmeal 50th of indian meal
- 15 dragged & ridged up the carat & beat ground in the garden
- 16 went to Brockville to about the discharge of ^{the} ^{money} Mr J. Herrie said that it was not discharged ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{book} it was not canceled they discharged
