**Suggestions in Surgical Diseases of the Kidney—No. 3.**

Blood that precedes the urinary flow usually comes from the anterior urethra. That which follows the act of micturition, terminal bleeding, may come from the deep urethra or near the internal urinary meatus, forced out by the contractions which occur to evacuate the last few drops.

Where hemorrhage occurs in the bladder, the urine usually is distinctly red and there is a great tendency to clotting, which may produce tenesmus associated with considerable pain.—*Bremerman; Int. Journ. of Surg.*
