 fine in the evening sun sets at 6 to night 10th Crossed to
 Adm ^{Wednesday} Hamiltons got a Letter in the P.O for myself
 Charante Che. of William Dufres Postage 3c
 got the witness to sit with J. H. Hamilton to
 Court over for Windy Drifting fine 11th Bore
 12th 6th or 7th 2 Dollars to 24th May of Plaintiff
 2nd 45 got a Pair of lace Boots to be exchanged
 for the ones I took home the next time I goth
 to take them back Heard one of the Mr. Kenyon
 cutting fire Departed Burned on the front side
 Berkely track crossed from the head of our Island
