

Hamden Gore December 1883

Sun Dec 16<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cold some snow

Mon Dec 17<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cold, John away hunting, I went down to John Steets this fore noon, not doing much this afternoon

Tue Dec 18<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cold, about two inches of snow fell last night, I was out hunting

this fore noon didn't get any thing, after noon putting up a load of grain to get chopt.

Wed Dec 19<sup>th</sup> cloudy and cold, was thrashing peas, John took a load of grain to Mill to get chopt.

Thu Dec 20<sup>th</sup> clear most of the day and pleasant, I was thrashing out peas, John went for the chopt feed this fore noon.

Fri Dec 21<sup>st</sup> cloudy snow and cold, we were cleaning up a load of wheat this fore noon

after noon took it to Thamesville sold to J. Syer for ninety eights per bushel.

Sun Dec 23<sup>rd</sup> cloudy high wind from South East, and cold.

Mon Dec 24<sup>th</sup> cloudy and soft, fore noon I was repairing windows in the stables after noon Walter and I cleaned up a load of wheat.

Wed Dec 25<sup>th</sup> Christmas day, cloudy and soft, not doing any thing today, the girls all home

Thu Dec 26<sup>th</sup> cloudy and soft, this fore noon attended the School meeting, after noon Walter and I went to Thamesville with a load of wheat. Sold it to J. Syer for 96 cents per bushel.

Fri Dec 27<sup>th</sup> cloudy fore part of the day soft snow latter part blustering and cold we were putting up a load of grain to get chopt.

Sat Dec 28<sup>th</sup> clear part of the day and pleasant I was thrashing out peas, John took the grain and got chopt.

Sun Dec 29<sup>th</sup> cloudy part of the day and moderate was cleaning up peas and some wheat to take to Mill, bargained nine lambs to William Smith for three dollars and fifty cents a piece to be taken away next week

Mon Dec 30<sup>th</sup> a soft rainy day

Tue Dec 31<sup>st</sup> a soft dark foggy day, the boys and I were getting in the old barn, this is the last day of 1883

Wed Jan 1<sup>st</sup> cloudy and cool, not doing much of any thing today

Thu Jan 2<sup>nd</sup> cloudy, high wind from the South West blustering and cold, Walter and I took the lambs over to William Smith this fore noon that I sold to him, not doing
