The writer praises the Rovsing dressing for extensive burns. The injured area, and the neighboring skin, are first thoroughly cleansed; an anesthetic may be required. The entire wound is then covered with sterile rubber tissue, containing many small slits; over this, a thick sheet of 1 per cent. silver nitrate gauze, then cotton and a bandage. The results are nearly uniformly good.—Wulff; Münch. Med. Woch.
