- 20th Helped Griese to kill pigs, and in the evening we went for a sleigh ride up to Simons where we were holding our monthly social evening, the evening was spent in games, music and a spelling-match, with lunch.
- 21st Herb Cunningham came up with his cutting-box and gasoline engine and we cut corn in the forenoon.
- 22nd Bert took his cow to Paris, sold her to J. Scott. A very mild day taking all the snow and ice away.
- 23rd Went to the Glen in the evening to the Young People's meeting, giving a talk on "Amusement that is worth while".
- 24th Re-started to cut wood at the bush, canvassed the road out for the Probation Petition.
- 25th Went to Debate at Farmers Club at Kitchens School. Resolved that the Franchise should be given to women.
