 2 P. glass 7. putty 7. W. Ellis paid one dollar. 14
- 5. I made the washing. Mrs Brown was in for a couple of hours. 7/4 loaves 20. Put yesterday at Willis ^{very} ~~very~~ sale 22 lbs gran sugar 100 1 00
- 6. Rain all day ^{very} very ugly day. Marion came last night. There was a meeting in Mac Gillivray Hall last night, starting an Oddfellows Society. There were 16 initiated, 16 came from Cornwall, drove all the way. Alex Macdonald got bits of plank to fix his stable floor. I did not go to the sewing meeting at the vestry
- 7. There was rain ^{last} all night and high wind and rain all this day. The W. F. M. S. met at John A's 8 members 3 visitors My fees 10^{cts} 10 10
 for Marion 10^{cts} for our tea 10
- 8. Dull day no rain 7/4 doz tarring 25 4 loaves 45
 7/4 lbs butter Factory Jimmie sent for 2.15
 cts of goods to Cook Illinois

- 9. Saturday Very fine day. Mrs Robertson called to say good by. She is leaving for Montreal. 7/4 beef 40 at Jan 40
 bread 25 - Farquhar came in evening
- 10. Rained last night. roads very bad. Our congregation went to Heptzabeth for morning service
- 11. Dull day. Jimmie went to Cornwall drove George, left him there. and came home on the cars. Far met him at the Gore, Murdy went to Alexandria and to Lochiel, took Betty. We were all at the concert a troupe of Scotch Mr Spence an entertainer Miss Nannie Macchin, a very high soprano, dressed in highland costume and Miss Newman the accompanist
- 12. Fine bright day. Paid Murdy 20 for coal oil 20
 55 for two lbs butter he got at the factory 55
 7/4 loaves 20. Settled with Jimmie for some things he bought. Got a cheque for 11.00 on the Farmers Bank, from J. C. Brown on the Bourrasaw Post note
- 13. Wednesday. Meeting in vestry Mrs P. Thomas My 100
 7/4 5^{cts} steak from J. Fraser - 40 40
- 14. 7/4 1 gall coal oil 20. butter 68 - 1 yd silk ribbon 5 93
 Hard frost - high wind
- 15. Fine day. 7/4 loaves 20. Folks are busy at the vestry. Marion got Ellen to clean the Hall yesterday. paid her ¹⁰⁰ 100. 7/4 lbs butter Factory
- 16. Fine day. 7/4 bread 20. Molasses 24. Chocolate 25 69
 Vanilla 10. 7/4 Cousin Major for patching roof of Post Off 30 60
- 17. Very fine. Union sermon by Mr Waddell. A large congregation. My offer 25. Sandy Robertson here to tea. 7/4 there on Saturday 30. 10^{cts} for shingle nails. 17 Murdy left for Cornwall by train 25
 48. Fine bright day. Got the cards from Cook, Olga Illinois, my part 100 Jimmie the rest 100 sent them to the Bazaar. Put at Willis 1 yd butcher linen 25 25
 2 lbs of currants. had worms sent them back 20 cts
 2 spools thread 10^{cts} 1/2 yd print 6^{cts} 100 woaden 25 41
 I am working at fancy work Mrs Ellis 100 on rent
