- Finished cutting wheat in 14 acre field a good crop.
- 17. Finished cutting hay in 6 acre field and thistles along the road-side.
- 19. Drawing in hay & straw off young orchard making 45 in all.
- 21. Helped to pick English cherries which was a splendid crop.
