- 9 Stormy snow falling. To pan bread 20 cts 4 lb. Factory Mr & Mrs Brown in for a while
- 10 Cold and a little snow. Butchered two cows Libby & a heifer, have Morris Collett with them. Paid 1.75 for killing. I cleaned the bowels of fat.
- 11 Sold hind quarter of Libby 140 at 6^{cts} = 8.40 do do .. of heifer 100 = 5 = 5.00 snowing. Muddy went to Cornwall. Pa wrote to D.B
- 12 Fine bright day. frosty. Muddy got home 10.30 M. Muddy took Marion to see Birdie. Election for first Parliament at Sepe

Pommet trimming 3.40 1.00 Farquhar came to stay over Christmas. Jimmie got rooled. wheat at Lancaster 25. Pan bread 20. Very fine day
