Wed Jan 17<sup>th</sup> clear and pleasant for a winter day I sent away for the Farmers Advocate. Thomas Bolton called in

Sun Jan 22 clear and pleasant. McMullen preached to day

Mon Jan 23<sup>rd</sup> cloudy and cold another Zero morning. Sarah was over this morning

Tue Jan 24<sup>th</sup> cloudy a light drizzling snow all day. about two inches of snow fell last night. no one in to day

Wed Jan 25<sup>th</sup> a cloudy snowing windy blizzard day. this was election day the polling was at Charles McDintosches
