Sun Jan 22nd clear and pleasant. McMillen preached to day

Mon Jan 23rd cloudy and cold another zero morning. Sarah was over this morning

Tue Jan 24th cloudy a light drizzling snow all day. about two inches of snow fell last night. no one in to day

Wed Jan 25th a cloudy snowing windy blustering day. this was election day the polling was at Charles McDintoshes
