10 Boys took Japan buckwheat to Whitford and had it thrashed, got about 2 bush. Got 14 bush from Whitford Jimmie went off tonight for Sherbro. It has been a very fine day

12 Saturday, very fine. Pa & Murdy fanning grain 90 lb tea at J. L's tick

13 Dull day, a large congregation. Miss M. Galloway, played and sang in morning. Miss M. Galloway in evening

14 The Fair began here this morning we sent oats, barley, buckwheat, Manxolds butts carrots, red & white got 4 prizes 1st Manxolds 2d butts 2d barley 2d buckwheat. Got 10 lbs soap

15 Tuesday 2d day of Fair, very fine, we were all at the fair, a very fine show of horse and cattle. I never saw finer sheep in Clungary Annie McDonnell Montreal was up there was gray frost last night

16 Murdy & J. L. Brown went to Cornwall J. L. came home but Murdy remained with S. R. Brown Got 1 gull coal oil at Willis, tick & loaves at Simlows. got 4 last night - 38. Pa & Jimmie put in some of the buckwheat. Had Pigeon with them

17 I went to see Peggy. Pa boys & Pigeon at buck.

18 Done a large washing. Quite a storm of wind and rain at noon

19 Got a letter from Sandy and one from Fargus Young Angus (Register) was buried here on Thursday 17th. Jimmie & Brown sent a cheque for \$400. four hundred dollars to Mrs John Clark, his uncles wife Hatty came to stay over night. Jimmie was fixing
