- 22 went to A MacIntosh
- 23 Jimmie cut hay in forenoon. It rained in afternoon. Preserved black currants
- 24 Rained all night and most all this day. To 4 loaves by Murdy
- 24 J. Lavett paid 2.50 for rent. Paid Murdy 24 for bread yesterday. To 4 loaves 24. 1 gallon oil 20 chuse 24^{cts}. Preserved gooseberries
- 25 Dry today. Church off 10. Mrs Falkner and Mrs D Rogers called ~~last~~ ^{this} evening. Marion got home this evening. She had two five lb cans of honey 1.00. I paid it to Miss Jennet. Mr McIntosh sent a small section of money in bank
- 26 Jimmie had A McDonald in fore noon. They gathered what was cut on Friday. Murdy by 4 loaves 24
- 27 Hot day. Jimmie cut hay in fore noon put in four loads in afternoon. The ladies committee for the church forming called here with samples of carpet. I do not belong to the committee
- 28 Jimmie put in some hay To 4 loaves
- 29 Boys put in all the hay they had cut in the forenoon. It began to rain about 10 A.M. and drizzled until noon, then a few showers. Moses Wintony paid 9.50 for rent. He is leaving the house. I paid Murdy 3.00 for strawberries and bread. 2.00 for the berries. Marion finished making the pint dress she got for me in Montreal
- 30 Working at hay. 4 loaves 24
- 31 To 25 lbs flour 90 5 soap 35^{cts} blueing 5 bread 24

- 1 Fine day. Fay down came yesterday. A long service in church. Mrs Rogers sang a solo. Gurdy Snider a solo
- 2 Took from the F Bank 15.00 Paid 1.00 for sugar. To pan bread 24 1/2 lb tea 20
- 3 Jimmie finished putting in the hay. Had Johnnie Stanish all day. A meeting in the vestry to see about getting up a dinner the time of the fair. Decided not to have a dinner but if the outside ladies are willing, they may have a lunch counter
- 4 Very fine but hot. To pan bread 24 Jimmie and Marion went to Lancaster to join the people who are going on a moonlight excursion under the auspices of Stroz church
- 5 Thursday. W.F.M.C. met at H McGregors my off 35 - 5 for tea. Very hot
- 6 I was down to Robertsons for tea. Mrs Falkner and Mrs Rogers were there
- 7 Still hot. To pan bread 24 fingers 10 1 lb lard 18 molasses 17 - 35 - Paid 8.00 to Murdy. Steak at Sandys charged
- 8 Very hot still. Long service in church. Quartette Mrs Rogers Miss McGilivray Clarence Cattanach and a Mrs Cook of Farmers Bank. Solas Mrs W. McPherson Jun, Gurdy Snider. Mrs Rogers. My off 25
- 9 Fine day. To pan bread 24
- 10 To 2 cans salmon 40. 4 loaves 24 chuse 24
- 11 1/2 lb tea 20 A Bee quilting two quilts for the North West Indians. About 20 ladies present. I went to Birchie's in the evening
