Oct 16 began to dig the Chilies & sendings there has been
no frost to kill the tops yet they are green

17 they are good size but few in the bush. Pat helped
finished the potatoe hole about 70 bushel in all

18 Rev. Mr. Dawsey preached with morning a Mr. Cuninghame ^{at night}

19 Ad went to Gananaque with Basie he came home on
friday he brought home a pump for the kitchen 100 bu
of oatmeal 100 flour & 2 Segan and other grocery

rain

20 fixed a post for the pump & other fixings for it
David come home after dark a little rain

21 Ad went to have the hills for a barn power & then to station
on a drag saw they are new ones sized them up & sawed
the most of the wood at the house Wallace & Bruce ^{helped}

22 Ad plowed where we had peas the ground very dry
& worked a little at the old hogpen for a hen house

23 sent a return of Connor conviction to Clerk of the Peace
Ad plowed in the pea field

24 Ad finished plowing the North west half of the
field that was brack up last spring

Mr. Cuninghame preach this morning & Rev. Mr. Dawsey ^{at night}

26 Ad began to cultivate the remainder of the Southeast
part of the north field we sowed 3 bushel of Peas
on the five acre the ground is very dry

27 finished the cultivating & began to plow in the
North east half of the field the wind to high for
to sow grass seed

28 sowed grass seed this morning early Ad dragged
it in we down in ahead of corn stalks

29 the Rev. Mr. Dawsey preached ⁱⁿ the morning
it being thanks giving day

30 I finished digging the Corns they are middling
crop Ad plowed & cleaned out the peas in
in the south half of the north field

31 Ad & his wife went to young this afternoon we
finished cutting the wood with the drag. There was a
-noon a little rain this morning
