I went down to Pain Court in the forenoon and back to the Wood Survey in the afternoon.

The day was very fine and the sleighing was very good.

Tuesday Jan. 5 1915.

The gas men came here and gave us the bills, Nov. \$37. Dec. \$12.95 = \$50.

The day was rather mild and cloudy.

Delivered mail in afternoon.

Mabel and Maude went to Ladies' aid at Young's.

The day was fine.

Thursday Jan. 14, 1915.

I went through Chatham Township and collected for ministers stipend.

The day was fine and thawed.

Friday Jan. 15, 1915.

Did chores in forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon.

The day soft and fine.

Saturday Jan. 16, 1915

Went to Chatham on the 9 a.m. car and with the Reeve attended to the case of Joseph Porter re Dyer Drain.

The day was cold.

Sunday Jan. 17, 1915.

Maudie and I went to church.
We put the annual meeting off till
a week from Tuesday.
The day was rather fine.

Monday January 18, 1915.

Did chores in the morning
and delivered mail in the afternoon.
The day was cloudy and it is snowing
now at 9.30 p.m.

Tuesday Jan. 19, 1915.

Went to Detroit on the 10.15 on C.W. & L.P.
and to Detroit on the 1.01 Wabash.
Came back on the 7.05 and 10. p.m.
The day was rather fine.

Wednesday January 20, 1915.

Worked at church books with Maudie
in forenoon and delivered mail in the
afternoon. The day was rather fine
and the plighny good over the greater
part of the road.

I did chores in the forenoon, Delos Lozow helped me, I paid him the balance of his month's wages \$5.00 I delivered mail in the afternoon.
 The sleighing was good as it snowed last night. Bruce, Wallace, J. Milner, Elmer, Roy Lohs, Ray and Maisey Armstrong were here this evening.

Did chores and took in potatoes &c during the day and went to Calvin Annual meeting in the evening.

Bought pair of fur lined gloves 2.25

The day was very cold

Friday January 29, 1915.
 Did chores in the forenoon and
 delivered mail in the afternoon.

The day was cold and the sleighing
 was good.

Saturday January 30, 1915.

Helped Delos and Bill Files to do
 chores in the forenoon and went
 to Chatham on the 12:45 p.m. car
 Came back on the 5:45 car.

Got a chance with Mr Silby as far
 as the School House and met Mabel
 on this side of Dunlap's.

The day was very cold. The thermometer
 was according to different accounts at
 from 14° to 25° below zero in the
 morning. The sleighing was good.

Sunday January 31, 1915

Maudie and I went to Church.
 There was a drizzling rain all day and
 became heavy in the evening and if
 it keeps on raining till morning
 there will be very little snow left.
 Maudie went over to the car line in
 the evening with the buggy and two
 horses.

Monday Feb. 1, 1915

I went out to the Sp. Hall on the 9 a.m. car
 and attended a council meeting.
 George and Maudie went round with the mail
 the first day for the long route
 The day was stormy and rained a little.

Tuesdaynd Feb. 2, 1915.

Helped Delos Lozon to do chores in the forenoon. Delivered mail on enlarged route in afternoon, Ray went with me.

The day was cloudy and cold.

Wednesday Feb. 3, 1915.

I did some of the chores in the forenoon, and delivered mail in the afternoon, some of the box holders along the 13th and 12th cons. complained that their mail didn't come regular. I told them I would bring all their mail tomorrow. The day was fine and the sleighing was good.

Thursday, February 4, 1915.

I helped to do chores in the forenoon and went early to have the Baldson and Mitchell's (Ray's) mail sorted with the rest of the route. Maude came to the P.O. with me and helped me to sort the back numbers. I left the P.O. at 1.15 and got back at 5.40. The day was fine but rather cold and the sleighing was very good. Maude went to her Grandmother's on the 12.45 car and came back to Kearsis on the 4.30. and came home with me after delivering the mail.

Friday February 5, 1915.

I did part of the chores for Delos and delivered mail in the afternoon.

Mr Kearns had the new and enlarged sorting case ready with the names on it and the mail nearly sorted when I got there. It rained last night and today and was very disagreeable all day. I took the team with the buggy and the Blizzard storm front

Saturday February 6, 1915.

I helped Delos to do chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. Mabel went to Wallaceburg and got Daisy and Daw shod at Putsy Pierce's and got home about 8 p.m. The day was cold and windy with specks of snow flying. The sleighing was good with ice and snow.

Sunday February 7, 1915.

I did chores myself today. Maude and I went to church in the afternoon. We had no visitors this evening. It snowed a little last night. The day was fine and the sleighing good.

Monday February, 8, 1915.

I went on the nine a.m. car as far as Pain Court Junction and walked to the Township Hall to attend court of provision on Collop Drain and Branches. Came back on the 6.15 pain Court car to Chatham and home on the 4 p.m. Maude delivered mail for me. The day was fine and the plighing good.

Tuesday February 9, 1915.

I helped Delos to do chores in forenoon. Delivered mail in the afternoon. Left the P. O. at 1.15 p.m. and returned at 5.50 p.m. Mabel, Maude and Roy went to a "Hard times social" at Calvin this evening and got home 11.40 p.m. The day was fine and the plighing good.

Wednesday Feb. 10, 1914

I helped to do chores in the forenoon. Delivered mail in the afternoon. Delos went to the corn show and I did the chores myself.

The day was fine and plighing good.

Thursday Feb. 11, 1915

Helped to do chores in forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. Went up to Charlie's after delivering mail and went to Wallace's on the 5.45. got medicine from Dr. Hay for my eye. Had a long talk with J. Scott. The day was fine and the ice and snow thawed considerably.

Friday Feb. 12, 1915.

I helped to do chores in forenoon
and delivered mail in the afternoon
Left the Post Office at 1.10 and returned at 6.20.
It thawed so much last night that I
took the buggy today. The ploughing
is about gone.
The day was very fine.

Saturday February 13, 1915.

I helped to do chores in the morning
Delivered mail in the afternoon, departed
at 1.30 and returned at 6.20 p. m.

The wheeling was fairly good.
The day was cloudy.
Left my horse at Charlie's and went to
Chatham on the a. p. m. car to
see W. G. Burrows re Robert Jackson's
Insurance.

Sunday Feb. 14, 1915

Mabel and Maude went to
Church and came home by way
of Mary Wierup's. I didn't go to
Church as my face was bad with
eczema. It thawed last night and today.

Monday Feb. 15, 1915.

I helped Delos with chores in forenoon.
Delivered mail in the afternoon with two
horses. The road was heavy in places.
Departed at 1.30 and returned at 6.20 p. m.
The day was cloudy.

Tuesday Feb. 16. 1915

I helped Delos to do chores in forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. I was delayed by waiting for the box-holders to sign for a registered letter from the P. O. Inspector.

The day was cloudy and the roads were very rough.

Wednesday Feb. 17, 1915.

I helped with the chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon with a team.

The day was fine.

Thursday February 18, 1915.

I helped with chores in forenoon. We put the pigs in different pens - the twenty or more small pigs in the large outside pen &c.

The day was fine.

Friday Feb. 19, 1915.

Delos and I did chores in forenoon. Ed and Isaac were here and repaired barbed wire fence.

The day was fine and the roads are getting good.

Saturday Feb. 20, 1914.

I helped Delos to do chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon, departed at 1.30 p.m. and returned at 6.25 p.m.

The day was fine and the roads are getting good.

Sunday Feb. 21, 1915.

I stayed at home to-day as the sozema was rather bad on my hands and kept zinc ointment on them. Mabel and Maude went to Church and then went to the Balsoon place to see Mrs. Buck and Charlie. The day was fine.

Monday February 22, 1915.

I helped with chores in the forenoon. The gas men were here our gas bill for last month was 13.63. Delivered mail in the afternoon. The road was very bad. The day was rather fine.

Tuesday February 23, 1915.

I helped Delos to do chores in the forenoon. Mabel and Maude went on the mail route and I made out Forest's reports till they came back and I finished the route. It rained heavily last night and this morning but cleared up in the middle of the afternoon.

Wednesday Feb. 24, 1915.

I went to Chatham on the 9 a.m. car from Wallaceburg to see J. M. Pike re Porter vs Dover and while there saw W. E. Gardiner re Interest on mortgage. Came back on the 2:15 from Chatham and took the last part of the mail route. The day was cloudy and the roads were very bad.

Thursday Feb. 25, 1915.

I helped with chores in the morning and went to Georges for his Birth-day dinner and then delivered mail. The road was very bad; the clay lifted and rolled on the wheels but it started freezing in the evening. It snowed a little last night and during the day.

Friday Feb. 26, 1915.

Helped Delos with chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. The day was fine but the roads were very rough.

Saturday Feb. 27, 1915.

I took Nell and the buggy up to Kearns and went on the car for Chatham, place. Maude took the rig to Kearns and went to Wallaceburg on the next car. Came back on the 11:30 and delivered mail. The day was fine and the roads are getting better.

Sunday Feb. 28, 1915.

I didn't go to church today as I didn't feel very well. Mabel and Maud went over to Pearl Johnson's and to the Baldoon place. The day was fine.

Monday March 1, 1915.

I went on the 9 a.m. car to the Town Hall to a Council meeting. Went to Chatham on the 6 p.m. from Pain Court and back home on the 11 p.m. The day was very fine and the roads are good.

Tuesday March 2, 1915.

I helped to do chores in the forenoon. Mabel and Maud went to Chatham on the 10.15 car.

I delivered mail in the afternoon. The day was fine and the roads were good.

Wednesday March 3, 1915.

I did some chores and helped Frank Lozon to load up the two sows; they weighed 380 @ \$6 and 390 @ \$5.75 = \$45.20. I delivered mail in the afternoon. Departed at 1.25 and returned at 6.35. The day was fine and the roads good.

Thursday March 4, 1915.

I did chores in the forenoon
Delos didn't come, he went to W- burg.
Delivered mail in the afternoon.

Mabel and Maude went up to Mary's
and the Baldoon place in the evening.
Charlie's Irishman came today.
I started on my route at 1.25 and
returned at 6.55.

The day was fine and roads good.

Friday March 5, 1915

I helped Delos with chores in the
forenoon and delivered mail in the
afternoon; departed at 1.30, returned at 7.30.

The day was very stormy with wind
and soft snow and the roads are
getting heavy.

Saturday March 6, 1915.

I helped with chores in the
forenoon and delivered mail in
the afternoon and drove a team.
It snowed last night and thawed
today which made the roads very slippery.
Had trouble with the whipple trees breaking
off at the ends.

Sunday March 7, 1915.

I didn't feel well to-day and stayed at
home all day. Mabel and Roy went up to
the Baldoon place. Maude will be home
from Wempis on Tuesday.

The day was cloudy with some wet snow
falling at times during the day.

Monday March 8, 1915.

I helped with chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. The roads were rather bad; the snow melted and in places the roads were sticky. The day was fine.

Tuesday March 9, 1915.

I went down and met the Reeve and Mr Fox at the Winter line at 10 a.m. Delivered mail in the afternoon. The roads were very bad. The day was fine.

Wednesday March 10, 1915.

I did the chores myself this morning and delivered mail in the afternoon. I borrowed George Demorel and took mail boxes to W. E. Parrish and John Garnier. The day was fine but the roads were very bad - the clay lifted on the wheels.

Thursday March 11, 1915.

I went to Chatham on the 9 a.m. car to hear J. Porter's Examination for discovery and to undergo an Exam. for discovery re Dyer Ordinance. Came back on the 2.15 and went on the mail route from there. Made went the first part of the route. The day was fine but the roads were bad.

Friday March 12, 1915.

I did the chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. Delos Lozon was sick and didn't come in the evening and Mabel and Maude helped with the chores. The day was fine and the roads are getting a little better.

Saturday March 13, 1915.

I did chores in the morning and delivered mail in the afternoon. Mabel and Maude helped with the chores in the evening. The day was fine and the roads are getting dryer and better.

Sunday March 14, 1915.

Maude and I went to church. Charlie and his man, James Ewing, were here when we came back. They came down with Bob and Kate hitched to the Democrat. The day was fine and the roads are fast but are drying fast.

Monday March 15, 1915.

I went to the Town Hall to a council meeting. I peck and Collop Drain. Came back on the 4:30 and went round on the last part of the mail route. Received check, \$12 on dry; 3 on water line and \$15 on salary. The day was fine and the roads are drying fast.

Tuesday March 16, 1915.

I did chores in the forenoon.
 Mabel went to Wallaceburg with the other members of the Piano Committee to make a payment.
 Mr Lozow and Dlos came and repaired the fence around the straw stack.
 I delivered mail in the afternoon.
 Departed at 1:15. returned at 4:05.
 The day was fine and the roads are dry but rough.

Wednesday March 17, 1915

I did chores in the forenoon and went and went to interview Rev D. L. Campbell re his resignation, had dinner at Charlie's and delivered mail in the afternoon.
 The day was fine and the roads are dry but rather rough.

Thursday March 18, 1915.

I did chores in the forenoon and started early to let Maude get on the car to Wallaceburg and I delivered mail. started at 1:10 and returned at 6:05.
 The day was fine and the roads were good.

Friday March 19, 1915.

I did chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon.
 The day was fine and the roads good.

Saturday March 20, 1915.

I went to Chatham on the 9 a.m. car and attended a con. meeting of the Council re Whitebread Drainage Works. Mabel took the first part of the mail route and I came back on the 2.15 car and finished the route. The day was fine and the roads are nearly all scraped and good.

Sunday March 21, 1915.

Did chops in the forenoon and Maude and I went to church in the afternoon and came round by the Baldoon place on our way home. Mabel went to her mother's after dinner and came back at 9.45.

The day was cloudy and the roads are good.

Monday March 22, 1915.

I went to Chatham on the 9 a.m. car and attended a Council meeting at the clerk's office - Court of Revision on the Collop Drain and other business. Maude delivered mail. It snowed a little last night and this morning, which made the road a little heavy.

^{my} Tuesday March 23, 1915.

I did part of the chores in the morning
Mr Loulouse came here about ten and
helped to finish them.

Mabel went up to help mother to do
the washing and ironing.

The day was fine and the roads
are good.

Wednesday March 24, 1915.

Did office work in forenoon.

Mr Loulouse did chores and burnt brush
back of barn.

Mabel and I went to Gordon's sale
in the afternoon.

Bought a Couch, \$3 and five quilts @ 25 = 8.25

Came home and finished last quarter of
the mail route.

The day was cloudy.

^{my} Thursday March 25, 1915.

I made up Forester books in the
forenoon and delivered mail in
the afternoon.

Mr Loulouse did chores.

It rained last night and during
the forenoon so that the road was bad.

Friday March 26, 1915.

I worked at Forester books in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. The day was windy and cold but the roads dried and were fairly good. It froze considerably last night.

Saturday March 27, 1915.

I worked at Forester books in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. Mabel went with me to the 13th Cow and walked to her mother's and I went after her when I was through delivering.

The day was fine and the roads are good.

Sunday March 28, 1915.

Mabel and Maude and I went to Church and went round by the Baldow place coming home.

The day was cloudy and a snow storm came up in the evening.

Monday March 29, 1915.

I worked at Forester books in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. A snow storm raged at times during the afternoon. I went up on the 5.45 car to Wallacuburg and attended a Masonic meeting and supper on the occasion of dedicating the new Masonic Hall in the Martin Block.

Tuesday March 30, 1915.

I went to Chatham on the 9 a.m. car and attended a Presbytery meeting on the occasion of Rev. D. Campbell receiving a call from Bradford, after hearing delegates Mr Campbell decided to accept the call which was granted by the Presbytery.

Mabel delivered mail on part of the route. The day was fine.

Wednesday March 31, 1915

In the morning I went up to the 13th Con. and B.D. St. Land with Foy and Fox looked over the grievance of Peter Martin and came back with Mr Fox for dinner. In the afternoon we went down to see about procuring a road between the 14th and 15th concessions near the Winter line. Mabel took the mail route to our own place and I took the remainder of the way and took Mr Fox home and went to the Baldson place for a while. The day was fine but a little cold.

Thursday Apr 1, 1915.

I worked at Forest's books in forenoon. Mr Tucker went with me on the mail route in the afternoon - departed at 1.20 and returned at 6.05 p.m.

The day was fine but a little cold and the roads were good.

Friday April 2, 1915.

Wednesday April 7, 1915.

Thursday April 8, 1915.

I did chores in the forenoon and delivered mail in the afternoon. Mabel and Maude went to a fish supper at Calvin this evening. The day was very fine and the roads are good.

Friday April 9, 1915.

Friday Dec 24, 1915

Went to Chatham on the 10.10 car
and remained till the following morning
stayed over night at the Aberdeen.
