Friday, March 13

- June 10<sup>th</sup> Drove over to Hill Killers after Sunday School
- 12 - Finished planting turnip ground and drawing out manure
- 13 - Went to our S. S. Convention at the Baptist Church St. George, the speakers were fine and it was a splendid Convention although it rained at night.
- 16 - Finished planting potatoes in young orchard, planted about 10 bags on  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre, largest Potatoes at south side.
- 17 - Communion Sunday at Church, a very nice day.
- 18 - Finished plowing root ground & set posts for wire fence
- 19 - Painted parlor floor in the afternoon
- 21 - Sprayed the orchard and burned brush
- 22 - Cultivated mangels & corn the first time and helped Bob McDonald to plant potatoes in afternoon
- 23 - Started to thin mangels, turned very wet at noon
- 24 - Edith and I drove to Paris & took the Car to Hartford & <sup>see page</sup>
- 26 - A wet day, helped to <sup>finish</sup> clean the kitchen.
- 27 - Repaired ends of the culvert at Johnsons where the ends had fallen out. George Laszlo's Father & Mother came for a visit
- 28 - Mr & Mrs Hoff and family came over for tea and the evening.
- 29 - Held our S. S. Picnic in the afternoon, which was a success as the afternoon turned out fine and bright.
- 30 - Cultivated the garden & the mangels the second time. Bought a Fred Archibald's name up for my Tomatoes for the 1st. <sup>4 or 5 lbs</sup>  
Sowed about 2 acres of turnips in the afternoon but from Russell McCreag called in the evening.
- July 1<sup>st</sup> A very heavy rain in the morning and again in the afternoon
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Cultivated corn & finished hoing mangels, also planted corn  
Started holding S. S. down stairs 20 min  
Put corn butter-beans, pumpkins, delima, beets etc.
