- 11 Jimmie gave Mr Crimmon a cheque on Farmers Bank for \$7.50 for our road work 10 days
- Murphy gave me \$1.50 for 2 days for him
- 12 This Paper's birth 90th year since he was born and 4 years since he died To sugar 6^{ds} bread 10
- 13 Borrowed \$16⁰⁰ from Murphy to pay a note in the Bank of \$100.00 got to pay taxes for 1909. To 2 loaves 10, 1 gall coal oil 20
- Boys working at the hay. Daisy call in evening
- 14 3 loaves 16⁰⁰ butter 35. Boys put in 7 loads of hay 2 in this barn 53
- 15 Popsy a sheifer calf it looks as if it came early last night
- 16 To 2 lbs butter 50, 2 loaves 10, Murphy by 3 loaves 15 Paid the note in the bank \$76. from Murphy 6 from Jimmie and 20 from myself or 19 = 100
- To 2 lbs steak charged at Sanders 60
- 17 Not many in church
- 18 Done some ironing. Daisy came about 10. a m
- 19 Ironing very hot
- 20 Ann Hall in day did not pay her Mrs McGillis Post Arthur called with her daughter Florence and Lily John Farmer I kept Mrs McGillis and the girls went off To 4 pe butter 20, pepper 10 bread 10 biscuit 30 Jimmie's juice 2. 1 lb butter 25
- 21 Did nothing but talk Jimmie finished all the hay that was out. There is some old pasture that has some light hay on it 3 lbs steak
- 22 About 11.30 a m Mrs Robertson and her Aunt Mrs McLeod Summervstown, and her sister another Mrs McLeod from the North west, called Mrs Robertson wanted to take me down to luncheon I could not go Mrs McGillis went. After tea Jimmie drove Mrs McGillis to John McGillis' He was barely back when it started

July 1910

- 23 Fine day I am not feeling well, Murphy by 2 lbs butter 50, 3 loaves 16⁰⁰ furiously
- 24 I was too late to go to church. Sent no off
- 25 Last night about 10. There was a violent storm wind lightning thunder and rain A large limb broke off one of the maples the first north of the front gate It does not look like settled weather
- Got Murphy 2 loaves 10
- 26 Card 20 molasses 17 chest 22 bread 15
- 27 Mrs McGillis came at 1.30 P. M thinking that Elizabeth would be along with the remains they did not come. Jimmie cutting hay on the back farm
- 28
- 29 Far was down today. Heard at night that Mrs Grant will leave here tomorrow with remains
- 30 Jimmie drove Mrs McGillis to John McGillis about 4. a m. Flora Macbennan and her sister Isabell from Midland came and remained until 4. P. M I did not get much done
- 31 Fine day, very off 25^{ds} John Sawdell paid 2.75 on 26th A McDonald paid 3. on 30th
