23 Annie came over and I spent an idle afternoon, it is nice day

24 Pony had her first calf about 9 o'clock, this is a very fine dam Far Marion and I went to the Gore, Far went to Cornwall we did not get home until $\frac{1}{2}$ after 9 P.M. Furniss paid Jimmie \$2.00 for rent. Oranges 10 cts
