For much of Frank McMillan's adult life he kept a daily diary. This is a copy of the inside cover and the first page of the original diary which Frank wrote in the year 1920.

Burlington, Ont Diary for 1920

March 3rd. Arrived home from California from our trip at 5 o'clock this afternoon. every thing looks cold and dirty every body here says it is mild now. after the extreme cold winter they had here.

March 4th. clear and bright today and thawing some first day this winter that it has thawed here they say.

March 5th. was out home to Burlington today. it is very cold again.

March 6th. staying in Hamilton yet. went up town to some of the stores. everything very high in price. especially furniture.

March 7th. Sunday. very cold went down with Dean B. to see his house. it is very nice.

March 8th. went shopping bot a chair and sofa. some dishes and a few odds & ends.

March 9th. Brought a load of things out from Hamilton to our flat. very fine day.

March 10th. Started to work painting the floor of our apartments. the one trouble is that we have no elevator.

March 11th. made two hotbeds out of some manure, that John piled up about two weeks ago. have a car on the road has been shipped since Mar. 2nd and no word of it yet.

Frank McMillan Diary for 1920 Page 1 of 41 March 12th. Put the second coat of paint on our floors today expect to move tomorrow.

March 13th. Moved into our apartment today. it is nice to be alone even if we have not got many comforts or furniture. went down town at night for some eats. called at Hicks for a short time. weather was very cold and snowing. sowed the first seeds this afternoon some Cabbages & Tomatoes.

March 14th Sunday. was down home for dinner & supper. Mr & Mrs Fred Bell was there

March 15th Went down town in the evening to Hicks to see about some plans of a bungalow. they got from Coates saw Charlie Coates there to we are to get his price for building in a day or two.

March 16th. fixing up around the house. we both have colds.

March 17th. Lillie has very bad cold. we went over to John's in the afternoon and she went to bed there. Chrissie is very good. nursing her car of manure arrived today after being on the road 15 days.

March 18th making hotbeds and finished car of manure also started trimming trees

March 19th very cold with north East winds. sowed balance of Tomato seed and Peppers started snowing at noon, quiet March 20th went down to see
Coates about building house
he wont take contract now,
saw Sam Oakes about digging
well. but nothing doing but
saw Bill Bowerbank who promised
to come on Monday.
was trimming trees in the
afternoon.

March 21st we are at John's yet but Lillies cold is getting better they had lots of visitors
Mr & Mrs B. from Hamilton, Will Bell & Francis & children. also
Mr & Mrs Geo Hammond. met
Mrs Hammond for the first time.
they are to be in the house with us. she seems very nice.

March 22nd. Bill Bowerbank started to dig well. saw Coates again about building house. he wants to build by day. work, trimming trees. yet.

March 23rd Fine and warm but they say it will be cold. saw the northern lights last night brightest we ever saw - Well full of water this morning. had to put the old tank in for a crib.

March 24th. Trimming trees yet was down to Coates. getting a price for the Carpenter work from them and the Cement and brick work from Harry Cuttriss.

March 25th. Went for a load of Bricks to the Dominion Sewer Pipe Co. got 600 all we can get till next week. they are \$19.00 per thousand. When I Got home the man digging the well had quite. too much seems to be going wrong.

March 26th Fine and warm trimming trees yet. Got price for the Carpenter work for building bungalow from Coates \$3400 from Cuttriss Brick & Cement work, \$1540 and plastering \$640. very high we think.

March 27th very cold today with snow flurries trying to buy or rent Mrs Benners place. but she says nothing doing

March 28th Sunday was fair and cool.

March 29th. started making hotbeds for transplanting very cool and windy with some showers.

March 30 cool & windy, making hotbeds. trying to buy the Filman property were Ken Bray is now.

March 31st cool & cloudy. started gathering brush in the orchard.

April 1st. cool. started transplanting Cabbages. showery at night.

April 2nd. Very changeable weather in the morning East winds & rain in the afternoon we had a thunder shower and before night heavy west winds and very cold. transplanted two beds of Tomatoes and was at Mr Hammonds

Auction sale in the afternoon first one I have been to in years

April 3rd Transplanted Cabbages very cold and blowing a gale from the West. made Filman

Frank McMillan Diary for 1920 Page 4 of 41 April 4th Easter Sunday, very cold and blowing a gale from the north east with rain & snow in the evening.

April 5th. still blowing from the west and very cold with some snow. great weather for hotbeds. half of the Tomatoes I planted on April 2nd are damped off now and more going yet.

April 6th. very cold with snow flurries, still trying for the Filman property. but can't get much satisfaction out of them

April 7th still cold ground frozen and covered with snow. finished gathering brush

April 8th getting colder lots of snow flurries and the ground frozen. Bray wants \$1,000 to leave the place he has rented. told Filman we would pay half for immediate possession.

April 9th cold yet - fixing wagon and cultivators also started the spray engine. and made a few more hotbeds, have a car of manure shipped on April 5th. went to Hamilton to see about tile for drain can't get any thing only 4 in Cement tile at \$40.00 per 1000.

April 10th John went for 500 tiles Mike started digging for drain. I planted a few more Tomatoes the first this week. also saw Filman again about the property. Bray won't get off now unless he can get another place April 11th cloudy & cool, and a drizzle of rain. went down to see Mrs Hicks for tea. and went to church after.

April 12th The weather has been getting worse. snowing from the north East all day. saw Filman & Bray about the property nothing settled yet, worked nearly all day oiling up car.

April 13th Cold with 3 or 4 inches of snow. heard there was a sleigh drawing lumber from the station. Unloaded car of manure for hotbeds.

Mrs Filman called up about land refuses to pay anything to Bray. so guess the deal is all off.

April 14th. Cold. ground frozen this morning some snow on the ground. Transplanted 2000 more Cabbages, making 34 sashes all together about 6800 plants. also planted about 10000 Tomatoe plants.

April 15th Cool and cloudy yet – transplanted about 5000 more Tomatoes, John and two men are putting in tile. started raining about 5 o'clock.

April 16th Rained and snowed during the night, frozen up this morning. Got some repairs for sprayer also two barrels of Spray material

April 17th. started men hoeing grass out of Raspberries.
Closed the deal tonight for the Filman property paying \$13000 to Filman and \$900 to get Mr Bray off the place \$13,900 in all.

April 18th. Sunday about the finest day this spring motored up to Hamilton and went to 5t Andrews Church.

April 19th. Just started transplanting
Peppers today. very late
this year. also started
putting on the dormant spray
16 gallons lime sulphur to
the tank. Cant get into our
new home till May 8th or 10th.
but can work the ground
right away.

April 20th Cool east winds and cloudy. Spraying, transplanting Peppers and hoeing Raspberries. We went to the fire about 8:20P.M. R.W. Dingles Barn burnt with two horses.

April 21st Heavy rain this morning making out Income Tax Papers trimmed out a few of the plum trees on new farm. they are not much good.

April 22nd Finished transplanting Peppers and tomatoes uncovered one Strawberry patch. started raining at 7:30 P.M. Rained nearly all night.

April 23rd unloading car of manure & making hot bedscool with some flying showers

April 24th Unloading manure and uncovering strawberries very cold. but fine & clear

April 25th Sunday fair & cool

April 26th. cool and cloudy. finished rakeing manure off of strawberries. also spraying and started hoeing Blackberries any good, look as if they were frozen badly. started raining about 6 oclock-

April 27th Raining off and on all day. nothing doing drove car up to Hamilton to get valves ground and steering rod fixed. John Babcock died suddenly last night. also Oscar Williams had a young daughter arrive

April 28th sprayed in the morning stopped at noon by high wind. drawed manure off Strawberries in the afternoon. cold with rain squalls from the west.

April 29th Finished drawing manure off strawberries- very cold.
Went to John Babcock's Funeral.

April 30th Started Plowing for strawberries, and finished with the dormant spray, and started transplanting tomatoes the second time.

May 1st. Cutting down Blackberry patch all frozen the extreme cold winter I guess. weather is very cold with high wind today.

May 2nd cool and cloudy was over at Johns for tea.

May 3rd. Transplanting Tomatoes, also ploughing for oats. weather is still cool and cloudy.

May 4th. Fine and a little warmer today. transplanting tomatoes in the morning today at Johns place. Mike is plowing for oats.

May 5th. Got 10 bus of seed oats from Ed Sherwood, at \$1.50 a bushel also got 40 lbs Red Clover Seed from Steele Briggs it was \$43 per bushel. have a very bad cold since Sunday. had to go to bed this afternoon-

May 6th. Had to stay in bed all day. it seemed about a week, as Lillie went to Hamilton to play at a wedding the men planted out some more Cabbages also transplanting tomatoes

May 5th. Lillie and I was down to Cleaver's and signed the mortgage on our property for \$4,000

May 7th. Fine and warm
John sowed Cabbage & Cauliflower
seed also finished planting
Early Cabbages. sowed
the Oats and Clover seed
on May 5th.

May 8th John was finishing transplanting tomatoes have over 15000 plants men all on a drunk but Mike who is ploughing old Blackberry patch for early corn-

May 9th. Married five months today celebrated with Roast Beef and Rhubarb Pie. and John Henry on the way

May 10th. started digging strawberry plants. only one man left. the other two are gone but we cant work 70 acres with one man.

went to Toronto in the afternoon. because we thought it was going to rain. but it only rained a shower.

went to see about a stove but they have daylight saving in Toronto, and Eatons was closed also got possession of our house. it sure looks dirty.

May 11th. started planting strawbwerries-

May 12th. Finished planting large patch of strawberries about two acres. looks like rain, and a shower would do good- as it is pretty dry-

May 13th cool and cloudy digging Raspberry suckers.

May 14th - shipped 1 basket asparagus sold at \$4.00 in Toronto digging & planting raspberries very dry, no rain yet.

May 15th. Motored to Caledonia and Hagersville with Jake Brant after men and berry pickers, got lots of promises in Hagersville but all spoke for in Caledonia, all going to Clarkson, drove about 90 miles. awful rough roads around the reserve sure was tired when I got home-

May 16th. Sunday fine and clear. but not very warm yet.

May 17th. Fine and warm ploughed out old Asparagus patch on Filman place and replanted it again. Cut

\$1.50 and \$1.75 in Toronto. also drew old Blackberry roots off. getting ready to plant corn.

May 18th Planted Early Corn & Pumpkins. Patch on old Blackberry patch. side next highway is Early Corn upper side is Golden Bantam. and patch in Johns Pear orchard is Hickox. Fine and warm no rain yet

May 19th. started hoeing strawberries. it will be a big job about 13 or 14 acres.

May 20th. Hoeing strawberries fine and warm. had to draw water for hot-beds

May 21st Fine and warm hoed strawberries, cut 11 baskets asparagus. left hotbeds open for the first time at night.

May 22nd Finished hoeing one patch of strawberries (3 acres) Fine and warm

May 23rd Sunday. had Harry B and Family for tea had a nice rain in the evening will do a lot of good.

May 24th. cool and cloudy planted Raspberry suckers the second time. all died (nearly) the first time. closed hot beds up between 9 oclock and ten, some holiday.

May 25th. Planted Raspberries in the morning and Corn in the afternoon on new place next road is Hickox, and May 26th Started putting out tomato plants, got about 6000 out today weather is pretty warm May 27th Planting Tomatoes again today, very warm and dry-

May 28th. Planted nearly two pounds of Musk Melon seed. out in the ground for trial. some say they will be no good. planted tomatoes in the afternoon. very warm and dry and no signs of any rain.

May 29th. Finished planting
Tomatoes this morning 15000 plants
they look pretty bad. ground
dry and weather warm.
Planted Cucumber seed this
morning and started putting
out Peppers.

May 30th Sunday. Warm & fine. went down to the beach for tea.

May 31st. Moved Jake Brant out from Hamilton very warm.

June 1st. Finished planting peppers. very warm and dry. every thing burning up.

June 2nd. Weeding out Cabbage & Cauliflower plants and hoeing strawberries. very warm. had a little shower for about 5 minutes. have inside of house nearly all painted & papered will soon be able to move in.

June 3rd a little cooler today

not growing very good need more rain. Cemented cistern at night.

June 4th. Cooler today. Hoeing strawberries, got our telephone in new house-

June 5th. Started spraying this morning. put in 5 lbs of Powdered Arsenic and $3\frac{1}{2}$ Gals Lime Sulphur per tank. only got two tanks on and stopped by rainbut we sure need the rain. got our new stove and also sewing machine today.

June 6th. Sunday, was fine went for a little drive in the afternoon

June 7th. Fine & warm
Spraying put on seven
tanks today. have
four men hoeing SBerries.

June 8th Fine. spraying and hoeing strawberries yet. planted out a few Cabbages.

June 9th. Finished the second spraying today it took 20 tanks of mixture to go over them.

June 10th. Very warm. Trying to cement around the cellar moved tonight into our own house.

June 11th. Very warm, strawberries burning up no rain

June 12th. Hoeing & Cultivating cutting Asparagus yet. Last shipment to Toronto sold at \$2.75 a basket June 13th Our first Sunday in of visitors Bells, Bonifaces & McMillans.

June 15th. Hoeing corn had a nice shower about 10 oclock started putting out Cauliflower plants at noon. had a - nother heavy shower at 4 oclock which soaked every thing had about 10,000 plants out by night.

June 14th Very warm. hoeing
Corn. it did not come up very good

June 16th. Showery all day. put up the tent and fixing for Berry pickers.

June 17th. Planted Late
Cabbages and went to
Hamilton and bought
6 bags of Potatoes, for
planting on old strawberry
patch that winter killed
Paid \$37.00 for the 6 bags.
planting potatoes in the
afternoon. also picked
first Strawberries 11 crate
sold 3 crates to Ross Hart
at 30¢ and shipped 8
crates to Toronto sold there
at 20¢ to 30¢ P.S. arrived late. Ex. Co
did not load, till noon next day.

June 18th showery. picked 12 crates strawberries sold at - 22 to 30 cts.

June 19th. Warm today shipped 13 crates of strawberries on noon train, will likely be cheap as there was a lot going. sold at 20¢ a box June 20th Sunday Cool and looks like more rain.

June 21st. Rained nearly all

June 22nd Picked about 85 crates of strawberries sold as low as 12 cts in Toronto.

June 23rd Picked only 30 crates today, sold at 13 to 15¢

July 14th. Picking a few cherries stopped by heavy rain.

July 15 Picked first Raspberries sold at 33¢ (4 crates) in Toronto.

July 16. Picked Montmorency cherries very cool this morning, nearly frost.

July 17th. cleaning some of old strawberry patch. will never get done I guess only one man as Mike stopped July 1st

July 18th Sunday. heavy rain again today. stayed home all day and had a good rest-

July 19th Rain again this

Had about fifty come from Hamilton to pick fruit. started raining about 10 oclock for a couple of hours had about 140 baskets of cherries then, and picked Rasps after it dryed a little. and about 5:30 in the afternoon, we had the worst storm I ever saw around here thunder & lightning, wind, and rain and a little hail. lasted about two hours, had about a dozen Berry pickers stranded at our house had to give them a lunch. and Donald & Chrissie drove them to the Radial. but found out there was no cars running, so she brought some of the boys back to her house for the night. while the

down on the highway to try and get a ride. I said to Lillie it was the end of a perfect day of peaceful country life.

July 24th. Very wet this morning, can't do very much. had a call from the Hamilton Jail three of our cherry pickers Jack Duncan, Dave Brant, Nelson Markle, arrested for being drunk, and fined \$11.00 each or 14 days in Jail. I guess they had better stay there - in the afternoon two of the Hamilton pickers that were picking yesterday, came for their money, one tried to cash a ticket for 12 baskets that another girl (Lillian) lost. (I believe he stole it) also he forged a ticket and made it read 10 baskets instead of one. but I had the copys and he was glad to get pay for 4 baskets instead of 25 baskets which he tried to collect for. Have been trying to farm a little this afternoon . I was ploughing around the trees in the old strawberry bed . I sure am some Expert Plougher, this was 24th Lillies Birthday so we had a nice box of chocolates -

Aug 26th very busy sending John Saso 150 plums and 180 tomatos today besides all our other orders pulling some corn now at 15¢ dozen, Golden Bantam and White Cory Cory has twice as many ears on -

Aug 27th . shipping plums (Abundance) yet . had a big crop of them – picked 26 baskets Crab apples sold Ross Hart at 40¢ .

Aug 28th. Showery this morning. starting to pick Burbank plums -

Clapps Favorite pears
shipping north at 90¢
had a big day picked
550 baskets of fruit
besides 120 dozen corn and
5 crate Cauliflowers at \$1.50

Aug 31st. Picked Bradshaws and Blue plums another big day shipping nearly all up north.

Sept 4th Picked 21Pt6qt bskts Burbanks going to try them in Toronto Monday morning . the men are cutting out Raspberry canes. weather is fine all week .

Sept 5. Cool and cloudy with a few light showers was home all day .

Sept 6. Very busy. loading 320 bskt on a car for John Saso . picked all together 675 bskts plums pears & tomatos and 12 crates Cabbage & Cauliflowers-

Sept 7. Very busy yet.
filling orders for north
picked 7 barrels Calvert
apples sold at \$3.50 bbl.

Sept 8th. Shipped 300 baskets tomatoe to S. Russ Collingwood tonight. besides our other orders.

Sept 9th . shipped a car tonight to John Saso 100 tomatoes 280 plums 12 crates Cauliflowers started raining about 4 oclock, orders filled . will have a double dose tomorrow

Sept 10th - Finished Burbank plums today started yesterday at Lombards & Cabots. making a fortune out of them at 30¢.

Sept 11th. Picked a few pears plums & crab apples to hold over till Monday also picked 12 bbls. Holland pippin & Calvert apples - heavy thunder storm after dinner. went in to the barn and repaired barrels -

Sept 12th - Fine and warm

Sept 13th. The storm Saturday the 11th done lots of damage at St Catherines & Niagara Falls. Hail. wind & rain nearly ruined the crops picking plums tomatoes yet.

Sept 14th Fine but very heavy dew. just like rain - still picking fruit - very cheap and getting harder to sell.

Wed Sept 15th. Orders slackening down only picked about 200 baskets today, started cutting early sweet corn no money in it this year did not sell half of it.

Sept 16th Had quite a few orders today about 325 baskets shipped north - weather has been fine & cool Sept 17th. Marchment started unloading our manure today. cutting corn.

also some Tomatoes, sold Ross Hart 16 doz Pumpkins at \$1.00 doz -

Sept 30th. Finished picking pears (45 bskts) cutting cabbages & Cauliflowers tomatoes peaches etc - shipping north . also shipped 40 bbls Cran - berry pippin apples at \$4.00 per bbl . very cold today. and like rain.

Oct 1st. Very cold raining all day. with some soft snow mixed in for a change. repaired bbls all day in the barn.

Oct 27th Rained nearly all last night, also this morning Loaded Cabbage for Saso this afternoon had about three tons. getting cold tonight. had a few scattered showers in the afternoon -

a wonderful fall
no frost yet. but
is a little colder
today They claim that

Oct 29th. Cooler today drew in about 4 tons of pumpkins in the barn don't believe we will be able to sell them

Oct 30th Had a light frost last night. first night, that it has even frozen the flowers. motored up to Hamilton to try & sell some Turnips not much prospects.

Oct 31st Sunday cool and cloudy. Had all Lillies people from Hamilton to see the (two) girls. also Mr & Mrs Ormie Bush. and Roy and Bessie Bell.

Nov 1st - Raining from the north East and very cold. was going to market with Turnips but could not get ready on account of the rain. started our new Furnace for the first time. the house is very warm tonight

Nov 2nd. Raining again all morning. packed a few apples in the afternoon.

Nov 3rd cool today went to Hamilton with a load of turnips. shipped a load of apples at night. and got another load on for market -

Nov 4th went to market first time, With Turnips & Pumpkins turnips not very good had to sell from 30 to 40 cts and windy. Sold four more loads of turnips if they except them as they are very wormy.

Nov 5th Took two loads of Turnips 100 bushel to Hamilton sold @ 32½ ct bushel-

Nov 6th cool and cloudy some frost last night went to Hamilton with another load of Turnips. this has been a remarkable fall. no frost to speak off till last night. Saw them picking Tomatoes along the highway yester day. also there were loads of watermelons also lots of Tomatoes on the market today.

Nov 7th cloudy. started raining a little in the evening had Lillies folks out for tea.

Nov 8 Fine again this morning went to the city with another load of turnips.

Nov 9th. was going to market but was raining in the morning. went in the afternoon with a one horse load that was ordered. Turning very cold tonight also took Jake Brants furniture to 371 McNab Nth

Nov 10th. Ploughing and other farm work todaycool with frost this morning. Nov 11th (Armistice day) signed on Nov 11th 1918 went to market for the last time was home at noon. finished drawing in corn stalks. turning cold tonight -

Nov 12th Ground covered with snow this morning very cold . cleaning up and burning Blackberry bushes - very cold this afternoon and evening with snow squalls -

Nov 13th Cold with snow flurries . packed the last of our apples in the barn don't know when we will be able to ship not till weather gets milder. Batteries in the old car went out of business. can't go down town now unless I walk. Hurt my hip and back getting off the wagon it is pretty sore.

Nov 14th. Sunday . Cool and clear but ground is frozen a little -

Nov 15th. Cool - yet. my back and hip is pretty sore. having holidays. can't hardly walk - the men were ploughing out old Raspberry patch -

Nov 16th . Back sore yet went to Dr Peart says it is sciatica. very cold starting snowing from the North East tonight

Nov 17th nothing doing

all this morning looks like winter out.

Nov 18th clear and cold lots of snow on the ground. men cleaning up hotbeds -

Nov 19th. Milder today rained a little . but there is snow on the ground yet -

Nov 20th. cloudy & cold rained a little again.

Nov 21st Sunday everything covered with ice & snow raining and freezing all day . had no visitors Charlotte was one month old today .

Nov 22nd Raining all day not very hard but enough to get wet

Nov 23rd Raining nearly all day again but is warmer and the snow is all gone -

Nov 24th. Raining yet this morning. the sun has not been shining for a long time - Have not been to work yet. but am feeling better - Got new battery in the car took Charlotte for first auto ride to Burlington. Raining all day.

Nov 25th Ground white with snow again this morning. at 10 a m still snowing raining in the afternoon-

went to the city to get the old car fixed cost \$19.09 -

Nov 27th - Cold and cloudy but no frost has been cloudy and showery for the last two weeks -

Nov 28th Motored to Hamfor dinner and tea.

looked like a storm

but did not get here -

Nov 29th. Had George helping me take down old fence along the road. some job.

Nov 30th. Mowing weeds along ditch and digging Elderberry bushes out. hardly see all day for fog -

Dec 1st. Raining this morning . and raining yet tonight (all day) . nothing doing . Fred Allen changed some of our electric lights

Dec 2nd Fine and mild started covering strawberries this afternoon.

Dec 3rd Weather fine covering strawberries

Dec 4th. mild with squalls of rain covered straw - berries in the morning Discing in orchard in the afternoon.

Dec 5th north west & west winds a little cooler with rain squalls, looks as if it would get cooler - Dec 6th. cloudy & mild no frost. discing in orchard -

Dec 7th . cooler this morning, ground frozen a little. but soon thawed out- ploughing all day and cleaning up old fence -

Dec 8th. Ground frozen filling up mud holes with sod from the old fence bottom.

Dec 9th - still drawing sod. Lillie went to Hamilton, one year married today weather was fine and clear but a little frosty tonight.

Dec 10th. working around yet. Light snow all morning but mild last year we were in Chicago and it was awful cold. 4 below zero they said.

Dec 11th Cloudy and mild, not freezing any. worked at the old chicken house all day.

Dec 12th Sunday was fine & mild went up to the city to Lillies sister's for tea. wheel of the car went out of business coming home cost \$20.32

Dec 13th - mild and cloudy looks like rain, was discing the small cherry orchard - not a bit of Dec 14th - had a thunder shower before daylight this morning. started drawing out manure from the hotbeds Blowing a gale from the south west all day and is a little colder tonight.

Dec 15th A little cooler this morning, drawing manure out of old hot beds -

Dec 16th. cold west winds with some frost - drawing dirt for hot beds

Dec 17th. Digging dead pear trees. Killed by blight weather fine frost all out in the middle of day -

Dec 18th Digging Clapps Favorite pear trees out the whole orchard ruined with the blight. have a hundred out now, and there is about 15 more to dig, that makes one half as there was only 200 to start with, and the balance that are left looks as if they would be all gone by another year . it makes you feel discouraged, as we thought we would surely get one crop of them at least weather is cold tonight feels like winter coming now for sure

Dec 19th (Sunday) weather fine but a little cooler

Dec 20th. Finished digging out pear trees . ground frozen

Dec 21st. drawing the dead trees out of the orchard and started repairing packing shanty -

Dec 22nd. Raining and snowing all day painting and repairing storm doors.

Dec 23rd. Very heavy west gales last night and today, working around the yard –

Dec 24th. Cold today heavy west winds went up to the city in the afternoon to buy some Xmas presents -

Dec 25th. Cold this morning snowing a little. Just enough snow to say it is a white Xmas.

Motored to Hamilton and had dinner and tea at Lillie fathers. quiet a change from last Xmas we were in Los Angeles, and was at an Open Air Band Concert in the Park. and it was so warm.

Dec 26th Sunday Cool and cloudy started snowing in the afternoon.

Dec 27th Lots of snow on the ground this morning sleighs out. looks like real winter. oh for a look at the flowers in San Diego this morning.

Dec 28th Cold today. pretty good sleighing now.
not doing very much put on front storm door.

Dec 29th - Cool yet but not extreme cold was working in the cellar trying to clean it up a little there still is a little water in one corner.

Dec 30th. milder today with some soft snow and some rain walked down town some walk from here –

Dec 31st. a little cooler frozen up again, and is cloudy and looks like more snow put on back storm door it was some job, as it did not fit.
