- 19. Dull day, Ann Hall 30. 4 loaves 24
- 20. Muriel left for Cornwall. 6 bars Comfort soap 25
- 21. Very fine day mild and bright. 1 gall lard 20. 1 doz honey 25. J. Laviolette paid 3⁰⁰ Muriel got home this evening. Jean is in Montreal
- 22. Ann Hall came in morning, washed all the storm underwear, 30^{cts}. Jimmie put up 8 big ones. To 2 lbs butter 70
- 23. Lovely day. The 3rd fine bright day this week. Muriel has a bad cold, he went to the Munch to see a bridge that is being put up. To 3 loaves 18^{cts}. Put up ^{windows} a Mr Donald paid 2.50 for rent
- 24. Fine in early morning but at noon turned cold and ugly. Sent off 25^{cts}
- 25. Stormed all night storming yet 10.30 a. m. Not very settled yet. To butter 63^{cts} paid Jim 2.50 for boy driving cows to and from pasture for five months
