We chored & struck out

 fall wheat then finished  
 cutting oats put away binder

& mower, & chored in evening

John Rawlings of Forest

was here today and has

offered me \$10 each for

a ram and six ewes

two aged ewes. <sup>10<sup>00</sup></sup> Shearling

2 ewe lambs

Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> fair

I finished striking out

lands for fall wheat

& we thrashed in

afternoon, wheat is

turning out about 20 bu

per acre & barley over

40. We had Bailey's machine

(I had <sup>just from</sup> had W. C. Cannel. W. E. Dougall

Barber Mitchell T. Byr. Harvey

& Fleck & Friendship

Friday 19<sup>th</sup> dull

We cleaned up around barn

& hauled, five loads oats

went to mill with Grist &

got 6 55 lbs. oat chaps

and grade heifer to E. P. Wastin 2nd
