Wednesday 17

Busy day peddling milk and washing bottles. Carl kept reminding us of his birthday on the eighteenth by repeating "So tomorrow my birthday."

February Thursday 18 1926

Mild snowy night. Had a great time up at Barkus at night listening to the radio, playing cards, and dancing with Jean. Lovely drive home facing wet snowstorm. Queen was all white when I got home at 2:45.

Friday 19

The morning after the night before but I got along fine wading through the deep snow. Blustery at night and turning colder. Paris tied with Dickham 2-2 in hockey game. Roscoe and Carl took ~~Francis~~ Brantford and sold her.

Saturday 20

Home in good time from route. Dollar day in Paris and saw Mother and Dad. Vernie's birthday. Alys and I singed "King" up in afternoon.
