Abstract of case by Dr. Geo. L. McCoy—Continued.

The diagnosis of sarcoma was made at this time, by two of our best and most skilled men in this part of the country. It seemed to the most of us, though, that there was but little doubt that it was tubercular in nature. We concluded to begin treatment by exposure of the parts to the X-rays. The mass when this was begun was spindle-shaped and extended from the jaw to the clavicle, and from the median line to the trapezius behind, and penetrated very deeply into the neck.
