**Nephritis During Pregnancy.**

Women with chronic nephritis should not marry, and if married should not have children. If pregnancy occurs in them they should be carefully watched. If the kidney disease is discovered late in pregnancy, the medical consensus of opinion favors tiding the patient along until threatening symptoms occur and then to induce premature labor. During labor nephritis require special care, and the heart's condition should be closely watched. Pulmonary edema or symptoms like cerebral embolism may call for a rapid delivery.
