1. Monday, Fine day. I drove Birdie to Branch in time for school. To 2 loaves 12. Called at Phil's Jims. Marion went to G. G's wood Mable & Murdy to D & R M L
2. Another fine day. I baked. Our young folk went to spend the forenoon at D. Falkner's
3. Mable left this morning for home by G. F. R
4. Very fine weather. Put in the last of the oats
5. Fine in morning. Some cold. Bags of small potatoes. To 3 lbs fresh ham 30^{cts} 4 lbs sugar At our W. F. M. S. in the vestry on Thursday my offering 25. Presbyterial 10. Paid Coors 13^{cts} for repairing glasses. Began to read at 3. P. M. D. R's wife took tea with us
6. Some heavy rain last night. and a mist all day. To 1 pan bread 24^{cts} Mrs D. R. paid the Test. fund collection
7. Very fine hot day. a large congregation
8. Rain all day. a hearty day. Ordered 100 of flour at McCrimmon's mill.
9. Had Mrs Kennedy washing 25. To 1 gull coal oil 25. Sugar 25. 1 bag salt 10
10. Fine day.
11. To 1 bottle fee oil 20. shoe polish 5 pipe polish 12 1 mop stick 18. 2 yds cotton 14. 1 spool thread 5 Paid 25 for broiled outs he got last night To stick 55 etc
12. Fine day. Friday before our Communion. Rev Graham of Lancaster preached
13. Marion left early to go to take Birdie to Cornwall. I gave her 1.25. she got one 1 lb B. tea 30. he paid McCrimmon his account over 98. Got 15 bush potatoes from Fogue 14. Fogue paid his rent 42.00

October 1900

13. Lillie Bellmore paid 2.25
14. Fine day. Large congregation. off for home Murrin his 1.00 Mine 1.00
15. Was awakened at 2. A M. by Pa. who was in great distress. at 3.40. sent for D. Mow who used some instruments on him with poor success. At 10. A M. the D. M. said he better go to the Hospital at Montreal. Murdy is going with him They left at 2. P. M. Marion went and telephoned to F Robertson that he was going down 30^{cts}
16. Murdy got home about 10.30 P. M. Pa was relieved, but will remain a few days in the Hospital. Paid 10^{cts} currants 15
17. Fine bright day. after a night of hard frost. The wind is cold and high I went for Birdie
18. Thanksgiving day very fine a good congregation offering for Cornwall 5. Hospital To sugar 25. Lamb 15. Soap 10
19. Fine day. J. G. B. and Birdie went to Montreal last evening. and got home at 8.30 P. M. today Pa was pretty busy. I took up some mangolds
20. Fine day. The girls took down the furnace pipes cleaned and varnished them, and put them up again. To 1 lb salt 2 lb Course sausages 30^{cts} D. H. M. D. paid 1.50 rent
21. I gave 100 for Cornwall Hospital Muddy drove Birdie to the Branch
22. Very fine day. To 1 gull coal oil 23. I made a small washing
23. No word from Duncan since Friday. To 4 lbs shoe 25^{cts} Mrs D. R. McLennan was due to dinner began to drizzle about 7 P. M. now 7.30 P. M. Morning the Brown left for West. Murdy
