

July Thursday 21 1927
Dan and I sharpened a mower knife first thing after breakfast and then hauled turnips four while Took in the 20th and last load of hay in field by horse and one load from other piece before noon. Dan in 8 loads when Mr. Piffers came over after dinner and we had two teams on the go and we finished the second piece. Hydro men finished building our lines. Started to rain just at bed time.

Friday 22

We all hauled turnips in the morning even if it was pretty muddy after the heavy rain the night before. Another heavy shower came up at 1:30 so that ended the hauling. Did some jobs around barn until 5:45 then Dan and I struck out the sod field by the house with the old team.

Saturday 23

Rained all morning until 10:30 while we were looking over oats for threshing then we plowed with both teams until noon even if it did come onto rain again. I plowed 11 rounds with "Gypsy" in 80 minutes and there were a few nice furrows in the bunch. Jeans and I drove to town in rain after dinner and some shopping for the company & ourselves.

July Sunday 24 1927
Not a very promising morning and Jan and I were undecided what to do until Mother called us and asked us to go touring with them and the girls. Were up around "Cousin Ted's" and around the old farm in the morning and had dinner and supper at Uncle Art's, stopped in to see Frank and Della's new house on way home and when we got home Roy & Jack were here. It sure was a wonderful day.

Monday 25

A fair day and I plowed 30 rounds in a little over four hours in the morning. Then in afternoon Jack Ball and I cultivated the summer fallow. Fell off cultivator seat coming to the house and skinned my nose.

Tuesday 26

Hauled turnips till nine o'clock then we went over to Piffers to draw hay and stack it. A shower of rain came up around three and put a stop to that. Started to plow then Mr. Barber took the team after load of lumber for Piffers barn. When the folks at home came down for a while and we were up there for a while after.
