

April 8<sup>th</sup> 1892

Fri, 8.

Lovely spring day, clear and bright. High westerly winds. Mrs Connolly, Gorkes, returned to-day, assuming a different <sup>appearance</sup> than that of yesterday, having changed her mind since the day previous.

Sat, 9.

Dull and gloomy, with flurries of snow. Later turning to ~~rain~~ rain, clearing off at 4 O'clock P.M. Sun shining at intervals, clouding over again, cold and raw today. Later, a heavy squall passed over about six this evening composed of snow and rain, clearing off again, lovely moon light to-night. Parted with a twenty five cent piece which I had in my possession for a number of years, stamped, W.

Sun, 10,

April 10<sup>th</sup> 1892,  
Beautiful and bright morning clouding over and turning very cold and raw, sun shining at intervals. Mr & Mrs Brown (Moscow) here today.

Mon 11

Cold day, froze quite hard during the night, Sun making its appearance occasionally. Met Mr R. W. Philips here today (McCortney Hotel) received word to come and commence operations in Cheese <sup>or</sup> factory for this season from L. W. Murphy Kingston, There were a few flakes of snow fell today.

Tue, 12.

Slightly warmer today, mostly cloudy, cold raw winds, west, roads remarkably good, for some time past, received letter from John Robinson, Syracuse
