- 14 Sold John Fraser 2 bush buckwheat for 1.25 Paid 1.00 I got last week for butter % 2 lbs butter 50. Mrs Withal died last night, her remains left here at 7 a.m for some where West, where she will be buried tomorrow. Marion and Murdy at the manse tonight
- 15 Very fine day, I made six sheets today and called John Fraser, their baby died last night - % 4 loaves 20
- 16 Marion got Jimmie to drive her to Lancaster to MacIntosh last night - Jessie MacKenzie was here to dinner, Murdy, 1 can Salmon Baby Fraser buried today
- 17 Rain last night, Jimmie went to Cornwall % butter 70cts. 4 loaves 20
- 18 Fine cool day, Helen Robertson was taken to Montreal, she is threatened with appendicitis they expected to catch the fast express at 4 P.M. & R.M. The Robertsons got to Montreal to G.H. where Helen was successfully operated on, at 8 P.M.
- 19 Fine day I made the washing, Mrs Ellis paid \$2.00 Murdy a wedge of cheese 1 1/2 or 2 lbs
- 20 Rain, not much, Marion got home about 10. A.M. She and Jimmie went to an old time party at Duncan Macbeomans (Ridgwood), to begin at 4 P.M.
- 21 Fine day, Mrs Christie, Mary Jane Robertson, and Flora Ann and Johnanna were here to dinner, Murdy went out today to Apple Hill
- 22 Jimmie & Marion went to a little excursion (on the steamer way) to Hagenburg, for hours

- 23. A lawn social at Sam Clark's 20 Con, under the auspices of Hephzibath Congregation Murdy went to Apple Hill, killed an old hen
- 24 Rained a light shower in afternoon, Jimmie went to Montreal to the Scottish games % butter 60. Bread 20.
- 25 Far came last night, J. P. and Bridie were down I did not go to church
- 26 Dull day, made a pretty large washing Mrs Ellis paid \$2.00 Bella & MacLennan here
- 27 Cold weather, could enjoy a fire in furnace. Bella is going to remain a few days, % 3 lbs steak 30 % sugar 25 starch 15 cream tartar 10 butter 35 Began to take a qt milk from Coatham
- 28 Still cold, % 4 loaves 20, Began to make a pint comforter
- 29 Finished the comforter Murdy left had Fraser
- 30 F.H. came for Bella, they went to Munro's Mills Began to rain about 1 P.M., Jimmie & Fraser Marion mounted a comforter Murdy not back
- 31 Fine day, quite cool, Jimmie left for Toronto % 9 lbs lard 35. 2 lbs butter 54, 2 lbs lard 30 Paid Coatham 24 for 4 qts of milk
