Thu Feb 6<sup>th</sup> a light drizzling snow all day. I was setting in the house most of the day reading

Fri Feb 7<sup>th</sup> cloudy most of the day and cool not doing any thing

Sat Feb 8<sup>th</sup> cold 2 deg below zero

Sun Feb 9<sup>th</sup> cold

Mon Feb 10<sup>th</sup> clear and cold. I split split stove wood part of the day. Brother Bilton gave us a call this fore noon

Tue Feb 11<sup>th</sup> clear and cold. not doing anything

Wed Feb 12<sup>th</sup> clear with cold wind. not doing much. Bilton was here most of the fore noon. Mrs Boyington went over to B Snarys, Arthur Gregory moved to Dresden McIntosh moved to Croton

Thu Feb 13<sup>th</sup> clear a pleasant winters day. I split wood part of the day

Fri Feb 14<sup>th</sup> clear and mild. I was splitting wood

Sat Feb 15<sup>th</sup> fore noon cloudy after noon clear and mild. I split wood part of the day

Sun Feb 16<sup>th</sup> cloudy and soft. Mr Burton preached Ira Greenwoods funeral sermon at the church to day

Mon Feb 17<sup>th</sup> cloudy and moderate I was down to the old place cleaning barley in the fore noon. after noon splitting stove wood

Tue Feb 18<sup>th</sup> cloudy after noon heavy snow squall fore part of the day was down to the old place cleaning oats. Walter took a load of barley and oats to Dresden fore noon

Wed Feb 19<sup>th</sup> clear and air sharp. was setting in house most of the day.

Thu Feb 20<sup>th</sup> clear and pleasant. I split wood in the fore noon. after noon went with Mr Snarey to Florence

Fri Feb 21<sup>st</sup> clear and moderate. John Farberdeau was here. Dick drew me some wood not doing anything myself

Sat Feb 22<sup>nd</sup> clear and warm the snow melting away fast. I was splitting stove wood

Sun Feb 23<sup>rd</sup> light clouds and soft. roads getting sloppy. crows coming back
