

Mr James Cameron Island October 11 1878  
 Nowing Randolph and I Cut 20 Cocks of Marsh  
 and put them in the Barn Keeping in the Rain  
 since September 3<sup>rd</sup> Drawing Wood  
 4<sup>th</sup> Leaning Down the Shed the Great  
 Race on Wednesday Flaplan and Courtney  
 5<sup>th</sup> at the shed the old man up from  
 Montreal got a Ride Down with  
 Captain Rankin and Penshauw  
 helped him Down with his Basket  
 growing some Grass also mowed took up  
 the Dumps as the cattle is getting in  
 7<sup>th</sup> Monday Working at the shed got the crowbar  
 the Glenn Washing the Boat fixing the case  
 the St Francis went from Lancaster this  
 this morning (Began to run last night  
 a great many Doors to Day  
 East Wind a very fine Day 8<sup>th</sup> went to 4 Corns  
 West Wind Blew hard at Lukes going up took  
 2 Bushels of Corn to Mill took 33 lbs of  
 Bitter to Do Lenny 63 lb (Yul) allowed 1 lb for  
 the Yul 4 cents Bought of 10 2 lb Pork 9 cents lb  
 2 lb of Salt 1/4 lb Pepper 1 cent 1 lb of Tea 40 cents  
 10 lbs of Powder 6 cents of Worm to denge took Dinner at  
 Got a Sumner Bought of Mr Bondeau 10 yds  
 of Calico 25 25 3 yds of General Stuf 45 Box of matches  
 15 cents 2 lb nails 8 cent 2 lb crackers 5 cent 4 Plates 20 cents  
 Got a Paper from Bill they had to stop and go  
 the second stay were too heavy loaded with  
 Barley on the 10<sup>th</sup> day coming home high Wind  
 at Lukes all night took Sam Halls wife  
 across very windy my canoe takes Bad  
 5<sup>th</sup> took Breakfast at Lukes Rainy Wind and  
 heavy Thunder & sharp Lightning Clear of Fine  
 East Wind Wind changed to West Blowed  
 very hard Blew Down some Trees  
 Got home in good Time

Mr James Cameron Island October 10<sup>th</sup> 1878  
 Hugh Annell Backwater Birth Day Windy West and north  
 Drawing Wood Working around the shed went to  
 the head of the Island Randolph and the Fox after  
 the Hen to night 11<sup>th</sup> Working at the shed putting post  
 under the side pieces and Bedms of Fine Day East Wind  
 and calm Snowdrains of snow yesterday a change in  
 in the moon full this morning a great deal of shooting  
 on the south side to Day then a steamer out there  
 at anchor the Month 12<sup>th</sup> Working at the shed 13<sup>th</sup>  
 Sunday Gordon Came from Hamilton they have  
 the Mill for thrashing Luskys seen at the lower Point  
 the goods over Baynes Fish at the Fishermen at  
 the Lower Point to Fine Day West Wind a great  
 many men Fishing Pickled on the Vates to Day  
 14<sup>th</sup> Working at the shed Boarding at the front part  
 all shut put the Tobacco in the cellar a very fine  
 Day sin Mild keep Saturday the 15<sup>th</sup> Cropped to go  
 to the Store stop at Manitowish to help them at  
 the thrashing Put in the Buckwheat Tomback  
 and finished the Buckwheat Thrashed some oats  
 16<sup>th</sup> Old Mr Williamson & Gregory Departed the thrashing  
 away for a Waggon I came home this evening Bought of  
 Ward 31 lbs of Salt Bought of Sumner 11 Batsville  
 2 lb of nails Hook & Eye 2 Window Glass Paper 10 yds of cotton  
 1 yds of Calico 1 spool of Thread 1 lb of shot 1 lb of  
 1/2 a Basket of apples cropped Bought of Hamilton  
 in case the Wind would be back in the morning  
 very warm weather this time 17<sup>th</sup> Thrashing Wheat  
 I went home with them spent up to the store  
 lecture on the front the 18<sup>th</sup> St Lukes of Israel  
 very warm Day High South West Wind rained  
 the night Mr Bender here him and 4 else 18  
 came home took a Bag of Apples rained some  
 19<sup>th</sup> Raining very high Wind this morning from the east  
 hoinged through the Day snowed on the mountains  
 to night working some at the shed
