## Antiputrefactive Diet.

When we give the antiputrefactive diet in a case with persistent high blood-pressure and the tension returns nearly to the normal and stays there, we can, as a rule, exclude any considerable amount of chronic nephritis or arteriosclerosis. When the administration of this diet, though it may be followed by great improvement in the other symptoms, fails to bring about much reduction of the blood-pressure (fails to reduce it much below 200 mm. Hg), we can be reasonably sure that advanced nephritis is present or sclerosis of arteries supplying regions of the body which are of vital importance.—Cornwall; Archives of Diagnosis.
