I didn't unload it till after dinner and it took me about an hour to do it alone as I had to

get up quite often to mow away. After I got it off me all went down town. Harry B. had gone down before with Aunt & Aunty Alice. We had quite a load coming home as we all five got packed into the buggy but we got here safely, we had to leave the coal oil can at Aunty's but Aunt brought it over after tea. We stopped in at the farm and I got \$10. from Dad. to pay for the hay. Dad got some of his fortune in advance from Mr. Parks. It has been a beautiful sunny day but cool wind.

Saturday May 9th

I took Lon's wagon and sack home this morning and spent the rest of the day ploughing getting a fair piece turned over. I am now nearly up to where the young orchard starts. Mary, Harry, B. & Gay went down after the mail this afternoon just as Mrs. Perry, Bess & the kids came along in their car so they had quite a visit down there. It has been another beautiful day.
