23 has gone to the Station with Jim, I had a letter from Randolph today, written on the 25th September
24 I wrote to Pa and will be looking for a letter

November 1900

- 1 Thursday, 7 1/2 gall coal oil 25; sugar 25 at McCrum
mine Pa not improving very fast
- 2 Marion went for Prudie. This has been a very fine day
- 3 Kaw & Cool. J. & wife came about 7. A.M.
Pa not so well today. The village are decorating for Jimmie, he is in Montreal. They don't want Jim here until Monday.
- 4 I was not in church today
- 5 Rain in Morning. We were told yesterday to decorate our house, that the address to Jimmie would be read at home, so early Murdy went and got 18 yds red cotton
white cotton 90c pr yd 20 yds
90c pr lb. 1.24. 2 pans bread 48
Mild stripped the goods down the middle, and they looped it around the front and south side of the verandah
Murdy & the girls left for Lancaster. Marion went with Snyder. Mrs D.R and Kate came and Cousin Mary, and Lizzie Jimmie and they fixed up a dinner
There was a fine reception. Jimmie was presented with an address.
- 6 Jimmie left for Alexandria to see Kory yesterday afternoon
- 7 Jimmie got home 2. A.M. so did Far it is raining and the fooling for Election of Den members + K.R. - Schell
S.P.M. K.R. is defeated
- 8 Far left for Alexandria to take the C.P.R. for Douc - St. Marie
On the 6th. Sir Roderick Cameron was buried in the Presbyterian Cemetery. There were wreaths of flowers enough to cover the grave
- 9 Rain & snow, an ugly day
