Kept no school from the 20th July to the

Aug^t.

Cut my Wheat, had 540 Sheaves
3 $\frac{1}{2}$ bushels sowing of wheat destroy'd by Hogs

Cut my Pease & Threshed them had about
10 $\frac{1}{2}$ bushels from 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ sowing

Cut my Hay at home about 3 Tons
Cut Hay at my Fathers in laws about 3 Tons

Aug. 4th
My Cow (Drupe) with Mr. Reeds Bull

Aug. 27th
Recd. account from Detroit by an Express that came
in threedays that the Indians had a battle with
Gen. Wanes army ^{on the 20th of April} and lost considerably, among which

was Charles Smith (Clesh of the Court) and Anthony Lapsell
also Dan. M. Heblep (formerly a Serg. in Butlers Rangers)
with 5 other frenchmen about 40 Indians killed

Aug. 28
Arrived an Express from Detroit informing that Gen.
Wane has retreated back ^{from the Miamies} and that the Indians

have taken most of their Horses which was
all the Provision Wane had to subsist his

Army - News likewise received that Lord Howe
has taken 9 Sail of French men of War -

and in a battle the combined Armies have killed
22000 French
