Very fine hazy Indian summer day. Willie and I went with Jennie in cart voted at Cummoek for Hugh Sathis for M.P. then went to Tom Wilson farm and brought home the 16 cattle we put in May 27th. In P.M. Ross and Doug up they hauled 8 or 9 loads to pit and loaded two loads of harnavel ones brought one load over. Another up in P.M. Willie down town at night Sathis m.

Very fine warm sunny A.M. clouded over. P.M. got misty and drizzle. Willie at Crabbs thrashing all day. Ross Newman up all day I brought over two loads culls in A.M. and two loads in P.M. we took over two small loads straw covered pit and earthed some of it. Gous brought up leaf stake 25cts

Misty morning cloudy, east wind snowing cleared off in P.M. got very cold by night. Willie at Crabbs thrashing to-day. I covered most of pit etc. Paid Doug in full 40cts I drove down town at night got at Mannis landing glass 10 inches 35° at Armstrongs salt 5°.
