 \$10.50 for flour to be got, gloves at Woods 50cts
 sugar 25cts: got goods at Russells on off.

 4 rows other side of patch. Nellie Milne and
 Ross up P.M. Ross to bid us good bye as
 he is going back to Ottawa to start for
 overseas on Saturday he belongs to the
 signal corp of the headquarters staff. Mother
 and Mary went down P.M. Mary with Willie & Ross.
 Mrs Frodsham called P.M. Mary paid her for
 Geo Douglas \$3.00 for his work and 40cts for
 tomatoes
