**Blood Pressure in Pneumonia.**

Newburgh and Minot assert that the blood pressure curve does not suggest failure of the vasomotor center in this affection. Low systolic pressures in pneumonia are not invariably of evil omen. Systolic pressure in the fatal cases tends to be higher than in those that end favorably. Blood pressure measurements in pneumonia cannot be used as a basis for treatment. Prognostic inferences based on the relation of the systolic pressure curve to the pulse curve (Gibson's rule) were oftener wrong than right.—*Archives Int. Med.*
