is pretty bad. Got 1/2 lb tea, 1 pan bread, <sup>3<sup>00</sup></sup> ~~pan~~ <sup>pan</sup> ~~furna~~ <sup>pan</sup> ~~pan~~ <sup>pan</sup> 3.50
- 26 Far & Jimmie went to Alexandria to the  
Nomination. The roads & fields are all  
ice (Aunt sent for 1 lb raisin 10, 2 lb rice 10 gave  
25 for bread) I got 2 pans of bread 50 50
- 27 I slept all last night, but did not undress  
This has been a beautiful day (Aunt got  
1 box codfish 50) Marion has tooth ache
- 28 3 P.M. Snowing a little and blowing, not enough  
to answer the old proverb "March comes in like a lion  
goes out like a lamb" John Catalanach's youngest  
child was buried today, 8 months old, Old Nancy  
Angus, will be buried tomorrow, aged 83 years  
got molasses, sold 1 1/2 doz eggs got 1 pan  
bread Jimmie bot at Campbells sale 1  
teakettle 25, 1 coal oil can, glass with tin  
case 35
