- 9 quarried some stones for to underpin the cow stable
- 10 went with Henry Young to see the pulpit in the Church
 Church before making one for ours in the fore-
 noon went to George Willsons to a beef cow they are too
 old
- 11 fixed the waggons for to draw dung I expect
 Michael Casslow to help me
- 12 drew dung to the Church field Michael Casslow
 helped me I hired him for half a month at
 the rate of eight dollars per month last night
- 13 drew dung to the Church field Henry Young
- 14 do do do do
- 15 the Rev. Mr. Robinson preached in the forenoon
 & the Rev. Mr. Wier at night
- 16 cut 5 rows of the corn in the forenoon drew 2
 loads of sand for J. Donling ^{in the afternoon} gave him 85 cents
 & got a barrel of salt
- 17 drew 4 loads of sand for J. A. Bradley
 in the forenoon 80 bushel time \$ 1.25 bound
 up the corn in the afternoon
- 18 drew a load of wood or brush in the forenoon
 to young in the afternoon ^{stapled at the dinner} size & the corn ^{new} I did
 last night with a bushy
