- 4 None from here in church. Dr called at midnight
- 5 Last night after supper Mary Jane Christie came in, she came to stay two days, and she could not go back. Dr Falkner called
- 6 Mandy went to Alexandria John Christie came and took home his wife
- 7 Fine day Agnes much better so am I. Put at John a 1 gall coal oil 10. bread 12. Hockey match. Rough Riders and home team. Game for home team 4.50
- 8 Fine bright day. I was churning every day this week and did not get a speck of butter Paid biscuit and sulphur 38
- 9 Fine day. but cold. Dr Robertson was in To pan bread 24. Churned two days cream Agnes not safe yet
- 10 This morning at sun rise Mercury was down to 2d and a cold west wind Alexan dice hockey team came and played with ours 4 to 2. I think. bread 4 loaves 24
- 11 Dull day not many in church Mercury 16
- 12 Monday, Dr Robertson called says Agnes is not over diphtheria yet

- 13 I sent Ann word not to come to wash 2 loaves 12. 1 gall coal oil 18 30
Got 3 Factory cheques cashed at Bank
at 1.48 20 2.24-3d 4.25 87-97
Mercury 12 This A.M.
- 14 Mandy called today
- 15 Fine day. Rogers of Presbyteria called, Paid him 3.00 for Presbyterian for 2 years, from March 1911- to March 1913 To pan bread 24
- 16 Fine bright but cold box biscuit 25
- 17 Very fine and mild 4 loaves 24
- 18 Very fine day None from here in church
- 19 Dull rained a little Dr Robertson called
" And thinks she is not safe yet
- 20 Another fine day John was down in afternoon thought to take Agnes home. but Dr does not wish her to go
- 21. A storm from the east, The Internationals of Cornwall came to play hockey, they beat the home team
- 22 The wind turned from west and is terrific all day. Jimmie went out for the first time Agnes still in bed, Dr not in since the 19th To 2 loaves 12 12
- 23 Fine bright day. Snow drifting. To rumbled oats 25 25
biscuits 10. The Dr. was in after night
- 24 Fine day To pan bread 24. Dr. He came and fumigated. he said. The swab he took on Monday the 19th had no microbe. Why did he leave us until the 24 before disinfecting? Stormed some. The roads very heavy
Only Jimmie went to church from here, sent my off. \$1.00
- 26 Mandy left for Lancaster. To some where east of the Brown house
