1. Friday fine day
2. Snowing. Jimmie went around with the snow plough in the evening
3. Nice bright day. Grant, a student preached. Given is off on his wedding trip. I went after Prayer Meeting to see Auntie. Mercury down to 20.
4. Very cold this morning. Jimmie went to draw wood sent a letter to Murdy, and \$24<sup>00</sup> borrowed from Birdie. She gave 25cts. to Ran. for G. 7. pus and 12<sup>1/2</sup> for my pus. Mrs W. Laroque paid \$3<sup>00</sup> on rent
5. Began to storm last night. stormed all day. Mercury down on Sunday night to 40. Jimmie did not go to the wood today I baked, Birdie and I gave orders for two pepper boxes, one nuptial ring 45 cts each - 1.35. Johnny M. Thurson the agent
6. Still storming 10.30. P. M. stormed all day. Far & Jimmie went to Uncle Donalds to go to Montreal tomorrow, sent \$2<sup>00</sup> to Murdy. Far has loaned the money to Jimmie &
7. Womens Meeting at Willie Slacks 6 present besides Mrs Slack. It was our annual meeting, all the old officers elected by acclamation. Mrs S. H. appointed as 2d V. President. It stormed all day until evening my offering 10<sup>cts</sup> 10
8. This has been a fine day. got 2 lb raisins 20 cts 20  
 1/4 lb pepper 8. 1/4 lb cream tartar 13. 1/4 lb yingus 10 31  
 1 qt syrup 15 cts. 1 bag table salt 14 29
9. Nice day. Uncle Sandy & Far went to see Peggy in the fore noon. Uncle Sandy, Birdie & I went to John Ross's after tea. The roads were very bad. We butchered a pig weighed about 150
10. Mrs Given was in church, and there was a good turnout to see her
