this afternoon the snow is mostly gone of the fields

3 a little frost this morning I attended to the cows
there was no Minister come on the Express I telegraphed
to Rev T. G. Smith he telegraphed that there would be
a Minister down on the morning Express
the Rev W. Wilkins come on the morning Express

4 he preached this morning & then went to Fairfield
Ad went to the funeral of Mr Wherry he ^{Mr Wilson preaches at night} drew the corpse
he died at Mr Clendinning's was buried at the London bur

5 Mr Wilkins went away on the express I went to the station
with him it is the first time I have been there since
I was sick

6 Ad went to the 6 concession to bank out wood and
draw rail cuts a little snow yesterday

7 very high wind last night and most of the day
Ad came home last night to get some pork peas tea
and tobacco Mr Cross his chapping for him

8 Ad went back this morning snow last night
and today there is a Bee getting out timber for a
shed at the church James McMillin is given the
timber

9 heavy rain most of the night the ground all in
a slush this morning still raining the most of the
timber was cut yesterday

10 Billie & Bessie come from Delta this morning
Ad went to Gonaquese this morning Billie & her
went to Youngers the afternoon the Rev E. M. Creston

11 Rev W. Stewart preached in the morning ^{here the morning}
Mr Creston ^{at night}

12 fine day weather Ad nor Wallace has been here yet
6 o'clock Wm & Ellen come here about 8 o'clock

13 Ad was drawing hay from A McViel's yesterday
Wm & Ellen drew wood here

14 Wm & Ellen went to Youngers this morning ^{most of the day}
Ad & Wm McViel drew 4 loads of wood here
