- Aug 7th Put arsenate of lead solution on potatoes in the morning, and cut Alaska oats in creek field.
- .. Cut No. 3 & Alaska plots of experimental oats, they should have been cut nearly a week before but owing to the wet weather it was almost impossible there were 7 good sheaves in each plot.
8. A very wet Sunday, went to Greens in the evening to see Bessie and Marjory Cornwall.
9. Finished cut Alaska plots. Drove to Paris in evening for ^{plant}
10. Cut mixed grain on hill next Cunningham farm.
11. Finished cutting plots in 14 acre field, a good crop.
12. A heavy rain in the morning, threshed Alaska & No. 3 plots of oats, the Alaska weighed with straw ^{75 lbs} grain ^{25 lbs} and the No. 3, 60 lbs in all & 28 lbs of grain. Cultivated turnips in the afternoon.
13. Went to cut Jack Mc Donald's oats in afternoon.
14. Finished cutting J. Mc D. oats and put the binder away.
17. Drove in Alaska oats 8 loads. Drove in mixed grain 5 loads.
21. Thrashers came at noon but it came a heavy rain about 5 o'clock so we did not finish until Mon. morning.
23. Threshed a Johnsons.
24. " " B. Cunningham and Mc Lang hills.
27. Mrs A. Gillespie came down for Flowers for their Red Cross day at Glen Morris and in the evening a load of us went up in the hay rack.
