Girls down town in P.M. got at Armstrongs potato onions & bananas 5⁻ at Russell's dress goods 74⁻ at Stals on apr. \$1.01 dress goods paid Pattinson for Bella hat \$1.75⁻ Received from Mrs. Wilton for butter \$1.45⁻. Father up in evening with letters from L. F. McCarroll Stewart. and Amie. etc. Sent \$5.90 to Hall Co for fruit boxes etc postage 5⁻

Fine sunny day warm. Pro Black here all day with 3 horses he cultivated most of J. L. field I harrowed it and sowed Banner oats and black barley mixed with grass seed in most of it. Willie pulled out some posts along J. field O.S.R. Checked 2 lands today.

Cloudy, rained some in A.M. got colder in P.M. Pro Black here all day 3 horses we finished seeding at J. L. sowed out with Waverly oats. In P.M. of Black cultivated No 1 E and Willie harrowed twice after him. Willie down town at night

Sunday

Sunny in A.M. clouded over rained at night also P.M. and snowed some. Mr. McVicar preached A.M. from Isa Sabbath observance sermon and in evening sermon on Earthquakes 1 Samuel I was at home all day
