Meltzer's Sign of Appendicitis.

With the patient supine and the abdomen relaxed the examiner presses *firmly* with his finger-tips down upon McBurney's point; the patient is then instructed to raise his right thigh, *with the knee fully extended*. If this movement causes or is inhibited by severe pain, it is strongly suggestive of appendicitis, the organ being compressed between the contracting psoas muscle and the examiner's fingers. It is always advisable to make a comparative test on the left side.—*Amer. Journ. of Surg.*
