

Mr James Cameron Island 11th July 1888

Fine Fined Stormy wind Rain Broke a Heavy Tree and limbs of the Butternut at the River some Boards of the Stables and some on the West End of the Barn. Blew Down part of the calves Pasture Fence and the Bush must have taken a hard one. Putting Boards on the Roof of the New End Finished but one Board to put on Lightning and Thunder Pretty Bad with Rheumatism Cool this Evening Deer Flies Bad Raspberries getting some Ripe

12th of July Orange-Monday went around the Island a good many Limbs Broke of and Trees Down with the storm yesterday Lamore and wife and 2 Children at the head of the Island since yesterday morning took them to the House slept all Day as they are almost starved out

The Bohemian did not call into Summerstown a Loss to the Fishermen Narcisse went to Lancaster put some of his Fish on the Cars 13th Lamore and his Family went off Mowing some in the Grove The Chiefs here wanting pay from all Fishermen for fishing in their water 14th Mowed a Road to the Back of the Barn put in 10 cocks of hay

15th Phillip the Fishermen took over Mail from Summerstown Oscar came here to night him Leander and Jo went to Fish Eels on Top of the Water Leander and Livinia to Kops Island yesterday 15th Sunday

St Saviours Day Very warm and Fine East Wind went to Summerstown Bought Soap 80 Bought for Fishermen Bread Tobacco sugar at Nicholson's got 6 Bars of Soap Went to see Mr Grant about his Horse Mr Knight and I Hemmett

Making a Platform and steps Made 15 cocks of Hay in the Grove to Day 16th Fine put in 26 Cocks of Hay with poles cutting some Sadhey came to Day

Mr James Cameron Island 18th July 1888

Windy Cutting Hay on the Hill Leander and all the Fishermen's Boys and Woman went off to night got Fish from them being and clearing the Tobacco put Pans Green on the Potatoes again made a Strough for the Pigs named 19th St Marcellus Birth Day Windy Rained Fine Leander and I Mowing Down on the Hill Satted the Cows and Sheep Thunder a small passed to the South side heavy Looking Back of Lancaster 20th Mowing gathering hay

21st Making coils of hay Leander to Summerstown Bought of Nicholson's Mothergraves 25 Thread 5 Pind Summits for the Fishermen got Tobacco from Narcisse 22nd very warm Tom Jack and Burnack here the Hokers here 23rd

Mowing Below the Grove cut some above the Potatoes took in 6 cocks Thunder Rained to night 2 on the upper Point a man and Woman tenting 24th Mowing 4 of cows the Indian children here Thunder Warm put some hay in the Mole Eels on Top of the Water hoeing the Tobacco

25th St James Day Mowing making cocks got about 10 made warm went to the head of the Island Leander at very well 26th Mowed a Road to the swamp Made some cocks Moved a Road Back of the old Garden to the Barn Ricked some Beans Rained some Leander took up his Line not very well one of the Fishermen found a chair on the water

27th Mowing Back of the Barn at the South side of the Potatoes Fine Gordon and I Jack here looking at the steers wants 45 Dollars for the Mare and Calf 28th Fine Warm Wind put the Pans Green on the Potatoes put in about 20 cocks of Hay George and Dick the Fishermens Boys Mr Streeter here for Milk Leander with Phillip to Summerstown Bought of Nicholson's 2 1/2 yards of overalls stuff 55 cents
