Colles's Fracture.

It is my belief that every Colles's fracture should be reduced under some general anesthetic. We may say to the feeble and aged that little in the way of reducing deformity can be done without an anesthetic, and we should say to the strong and the vigorous that under an anesthetic we can correct the deformity far better and restore the hand to usefulness in much less time. In the muscular arm with impacted fragments more or less complete relaxation of the muscle is necessary for proper treatment. Complete ether anesthesia is desirable, but ethyl chloride will give us a fair opportunity to accomplish our purpose.—Dr. W. A. Rankin; Long Isl. Med. Journ.
