cartridge missed fire on second one.

Lost some runs through not knowing runways.
Turk & speckles ran a little buck past Sawyer
who shot at it & they killed it on the ice on Ogden's
Lake, I followed them up & hung it up.

SATURDAY, 12

one doe at Kings.
I shot the feet off a young buck standing on the ice
at Ogden's lake.

This day a failure, as dogs got away, & some bad shooting done.

fired 6 shots at & missed. altogether 48 shots fired
that morning.

In afternoon went after deer with wagon. Did not parkidge
we are just getting posted as to runways. all season has been
bad for hunting, as the leaves are dry all the time.
A 30.30 would be the best rifle for here.

1.30 p.m. 14 miles. with 6 deer, leaving 3 hanging
up, & 3 eaten or being eaten.
